# Matthew 14:13-21 Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

Again this month, I find myself interested in what happens right before the well known miracle.

Jesus and the disciples have just learned about the death of their friend/cousin/mentor, John the Baptist. They were originally trying to find a quiet place to grieve the loss. But the crowds followed them, and the day grew long.

Still, the disciples think of others. They see the needs of the people in the crowd: everyone is hungry. They propose a solution: Jesus should press "Pause" on his lectures, we need an intermission, send everyone away to find food, maybe resume tomorrow. But Jesus has a different plan: verse 16, "You give them something to eat."

I can feel myself responding with the disciples. "How? ... How can I be of any help to someone else? I'm not even sure how to take care of myself right now." Are you feeling that today too? Have you felt like this at some point this year?

Jesus says to us, as he said to the disciples long ago, "Bring what you have to me. No matter how small. If you share with open hands, generosity, and compassion, there will be enough."

### **Pastor Andrew Recommends:**

### COOPERATIVE BOARD GAMES

We've all been stuck inside more than usual this year. Now that the sun is going down earlier and the air is getting colder, there's going to be even more time spent indoors.

When someone says "board games," love them or hate them, your mind probably goes to some of the classics. Monopoly, Checkers, Risk, Trivial Pursuit, Uno, etc.

I have some newer favorites. Ticket to Ride, Settlers of Catan, Small World, Dominion.

But all of those games are competitive games. There might be teams, but players still compete against one another. Someone wins and someone loses. (Or someone flips the board and scatters all the pieces in frustration before reaching the end.)

Did you know there are some really great games that promote **cooperation** and **teamwork** instead? Games where everyone has to work together to win. Or everyone loses together — providing the opportunity to model losing in a healthy way (and maybe have fewer board flips in the future).

There is a really good cooperative board game called Pandemic where players work together to prevent several diseases from spreading across the globe. However, that might be touching a sensitive subject this year. Instead, I recommend a smaller (and cheaper) game called Forbidden Island.

Forbidden Island has a very similar setup to Pandemic where each player has their own role and special ability. But here, 2 to 4 players work together to rescue four treasures from the island before it sinks into the ocean. (~30 minutes)

If you are a fan of games and want to recommend others, I'd love to hear your recommendations too!
