As you may know, I have been leading a small group through a Bible Study on the gospel of Luke.

We start each week with a video lesson, which is something that I have not done in years. It's been fun listening to someone else offer the sermon for a change. Then, along with the other members of the group, I get to share my thoughts on the video and the Scripture passage.

One of our lessons looked at Luke 5:1-11.

Kristy Cambron, our author, wanted us to notice that Jesus, in the story where he calls his first disciples, is preaching from Simon Peter's boat. He tells Simon to "Put out into the deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." (Luke 5:4 NIV) After an astounding catch of fish, Jesus tells Peter "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." (Luke 5:10 NIV)

Right from the start, Jesus let his disciples know this would not be an easy venture. They will be challenged. Following Jesus will take them to the deep waters, where life can be scary, chaotic, and dangerous.

Life has been challenging lately. The world is changing. We are still in the midst of it. You might feel like you are caught in the middle of a storm, in the chaos of deep waters, unable to see the shore you left, uncertain where the ship is going. I know I've felt that way recently.

Often, it seems, this is how God encourages us to grow. Jesus leads us to the deep places. But He does not send us there alone. Like in the story found in Luke 5, Jesus is right here with us in the boat.


What is Pastor Andrew Reading:

Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks by Diana Butler Bass

In truth, I read this book a few years ago, but it seems appropriate for the month of Thanksgiving. I wanted to read a book each month this year, but I'm having trouble keeping up the pace! Hopefully I will skim through this one again this month as I also try to finish a couple of the other books I have started this year.

While four out of five Americans have told pollsters they feel gratitude in their daily lives, cultural commentator and religion expert Diana Butler Bass finds that claim to be at odds with the discontent that permeates modern society.



There is a gap, she argues, between our desire to be grateful and our ability to behave gratefully - a divide that influences our understanding of morality, worship, and institutional religion itself. In *Grateful*, Bass challenges listeners to think about the impact gratitude has in our spiritual lives and encourages them to make gratitude a "difficult and much-needed spiritual practice for our personal lives and to make a better world".

Gratitude is partially an individual, emotional response to our circumstances, but research has shown that what we often miss is how much more it is a communal, actionable response. Bass examines this more unexpected experience of gratitude and reveals how people and communities can practice it and thrive.

OCTOBER SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Session of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church met on October 26, 2021

- Together we covered our church and congregation with prayer, studied the Bible, reviewed all that has been going on, and discussed upcoming events.
- We read and reflected on Luke 5:1-11.
- Approved Session minutes from September 2021.
- First read of the 2022 Budget was presented
- Job descriptions for open church positions were discussed and approved. Personnel will be receiving resumes.
- Soccer Shots will be returning on Wednesday evenings in November, and was approved to rent the Fellowship Hall for a number of Winter classes.
- Cleaning up rooms throughout the church, it was found that the cribs in the diaper change room beside the nursery were of a (no longer recommended) drop-side style. To comply with safety standards the church plans to remove them and replace they with a standard Pack 'n Play. A big "Thank you!" to Mark Arnold who was able to convert one of the cribs into a bench seat for siblings who have to wait while a little brother or sister is getting their diaper changed.
- Wall unit air conditioners in the sanctuary are in need of repair/replace. Bids are being gathered.
- Employee recognition gifts were given to John Bankosh (Custodian Appreciation Day, October 2) and Rev. Andrew Wirt (Pastor Appreciation Day, October 10)
- Coat drive has started. 54 coats were requested this year. Fewer than in years past, but the need is still present. We are still seeking financial donations to help cover the cost. Anyone can give online or by envelopes available in the pews.
- Food2Go collection box will go back out into the circle driveway every Monday for community donations.
