Hello to all the newsletter readers of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church!

He was all alone for a long time. But he had a little stream providing him water and the Lord sent ravens to deliver him food every morning and evening. # Pastor Andrew Recommends:

My Mask Protects You. Your Mask Protects Me.

CDC recommends that you wear masks in public settings around people who don't live in your household and when you can't stay 6 feet away from others. Masks help stop the spread of COVID-19 to others. ~~ quote from cdc.gov

You may have noticed that there seems to be some debate in the world today about whether churches (and/or Christians) should follow government restrictions and guidelines around the corona virus pandemic (or any number of other topics).

Many have been guilty (intentionally or unintentionally) of taking single verses of Scripture and applying them without context to support an opinion they had already formed beforehand.

- Romans 13:1 says we have to obey the CDC!
- Galatians 5:1 says I can do whatever I want!

Well, I know the CDC says I should wear a mask, and I know I don't want to. So what should I do?

Going a little deeper, <u>Galatians 5:13-14</u> says that whatever freedom we do have, we are to use to serve one another humbly in love.

Therefore, if we are free to make our own choices, it seems to me that followers of Jesus should choose personal humility and service to others. Right now, regardless of what it physically does, a mask sends a message. It says, "I'm willing to sacrifice my own comfort in the chance that it might protect you," and that sounds like something Jesus (and Mister Rogers) would say. So I still don't know what I have to do, but I know what I will choose to do.

# **WORSHIP ATTENDANCE**

Worship Attendance is different than it was in March. (That's probably an understatement.)

There have been a few questions about what WHPC attendance looks like these days. With all the different options for attending worship now, you can't just look around and know who all is with us.

It's difficult to compare to pre-pandemic statistics because so much is different. However, we have been reopened long enough to start to have a picture of the post-shutdown situation that we can share with you.

Looking at attendance numbers since July when we fully reopened to 2 in-person worship services, the 8:30 service averages 14 people, the 11:00 service averages 23 people, bringing the in-person average to 37 people.

Our live call-in has a small but steady attendance of 1-3 listeners.

Worship at-home online is harder to gauge because one view could be one person on their phone or an entire family streaming it to the television. So let's split the difference and imagine each view is two people. YouTube shows lots of views at first, but they count every time a video plays even just a few seconds. If you account for "unique views" and average play time, it would seem that we average 6 times per week that the video is played start to finish. (There has been some conversations though that YouTube may be only counting the views actually at the YouTube page. Are they counting views through Facebook or on the church website? So our number here could be even higher.)

We have an audio only, podcast version available from the church website, but the average weekly download is between 0 and 1.

We also mail DVDs of the full service to those who have requested, and that is usually 3 each week.

Pulling all this together, it looks like our average attendance across all platforms is around 55 people right now.

Naturally, there is fluctuation in the numbers week to week, but overall the numbers are steady, neither steadily increasing or decreasing. The last Sunday in September, September 26, was actually our second highest in-person attendance since the shut down.

# SEPTEMBER SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Together we covered our church and congregation with prayer, reviewed all that has been going on with the church and the world.
- Approved Session minutes from August 2020.
- The preschool has began and has a total of 23 students in the am&pm classes combined
- The hallway by the school side is now the Sunday school hallway from Pre-K through 6th grade
- The Food2Go4Kids program will begin distribution on October 8.
- We are asking the Congregation to donate the Preschool with individually packed snacks the 2nd Sunday of each month. (Though thanks to your generosity, the stock is in good shape for right now)
- One of the furnaces will be repaired for \$200
- Baptism approved for Emett Vanderlee (date TBD)
- Sunday school Halloween party approved
- Signs regarding skateboarders to go out front



Each church committee will have a table with treats for the kids! If your child(ren) plan to attend, please let your Sunday school teacher know or call the church office.






