Supporting PDA (Presbyterian Disaster Assistance)

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance enables congregations and mission partners of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crises and catastrophic events.

You might be used to hearing about PDA as one of the organizations supported by the One Great Hour of Sharing donations that we make during Easter, but their work is year round, and they need support year round—especially in a year like this one.

Your donation to PDA, of any amount, would allow them to continue their important work of helping others, such as:

- PDA is working with the Presbyteries of North Central Iowa, Des Moines, Prospect Hill and East Iowa to respond to severe thunderstorms that struck on August 10 with long track damaging winds (derecho) which devastated Iowa, causing widespread power outages for more than 150,000 people for several days.
- PDA is working with our international partners where Hurricane Laura impacted Haiti and the Dominican Republic, in addition to affected U.S. presbyteries. Hurricane Laura, the strong category 4 storm, made landfall in the early hours of August 27 on the coast of Louisiana, about 30 miles from the Texas border, bringing lashing rain and sustained winds of 130 miles per hour.


What does the Food2Go4Kids Program Do?
