# **Integrate RIASEC into the Learning Intentions**



Anderson and Krathwohl's revised Bloom's taxonomy categorizes cognitive skills into six major categories. The Holland Codes (RIASEC codes) represent six interests types for describing personalities and work environments.

These verbs reflect the cognitive actions associated with each category of Bloom's taxonomy while loosely connecting to the characteristics of the Holland Codes. It's important to note that the alignment is **not direct** as these models serve different purposes and have distinct structures, but these verbs can give an idea of activities or skills typically associated with each category.

### Realistic (Doer) - These individuals prefer hands-on, practical tasks:
