



## World Languages: RIASEC Classroom Connections

These examples of career connections across RIASEC themes help educators get started so they can further customize RIASEC-aligned examples for their content. RIASEC themes help students name and claim their interests and explore future options. Real-world examples as part of ongoing instruction improve engagement, relevance, and purpose.

### **Realistic (R)**

- Interpreter for Technical Fields: Discuss the critical role of interpreters in facilitating communication in technical or scientific settings, emphasizing the precision and specialized knowledge required.
- Culinary Arts Professional: Explore how mastery of a language enhances understanding of culinary traditions, techniques, and international kitchen management.

### **Investigative (I)**

- Linguist: Introduce the study of language structure, history, and evolution, focusing on research and analysis to understand language patterns.
- Language Technology Developer: Highlight the role of developing software and tools for language learning, translation, and communication.

### **Artistic (A)**

- Literary Translator: Discuss the creative nuances of translating literature, poetry, and other art forms, maintaining the original's tone, style, and emotion.
- Cultural Program Coordinator: Explore careers in organizing cultural exchange programs, art exhibitions, and festivals that showcase linguistic diversity.

### **Social (S)**

- Foreign Language Teacher: Emphasize the impact of teaching languages on bridging cultural gaps and fostering global understanding.
- International Relations Specialist: Introduce the role of utilizing language skills in diplomacy, peacekeeping, and international cooperation.

### **Enterprising (E)**

- International Business Consultant: Discuss how language skills are critical for negotiating, understanding market nuances, and building relationships in the global business arena.
- Tourism and Travel Manager: Explore the management of travel services, enhancing tourist experiences through deep knowledge of languages and cultures.

### **Conventional (C)**

- Multilingual Customer Support: Highlight the importance of offering support and services to customers worldwide, requiring fluency in multiple languages.
- Translation and Localization Specialist: Discuss the process of adapting products, services, and content to different languages and cultures, ensuring accuracy and cultural sensitivity.
