**WELCOME TO PARASHA #3 OF THE TORAH: LEJ AWAY THAT MEANS GO TO YOURSELF**

In this parasha we will learn the story of Avram, a man who confided and obeyed the Eternal leaving his father's house in the company of his wife Saray, his nephew Lot, his father and the people who accompanied him from Haran. On that trip they walked for a long time and arrived at a place where the Eternal made another promise, saying that "All this land you see will belong to your children and grandchildren. He was very happy and thanked the Eternal. They kept walking and walking through many places. During this time walking there was hunger on the land and then Avram went to seek food in a distant country called Mitzrayim (Egypt), he and all his people stayed to live in that country because there was plenty of food; when they left there, the pharaoh gave Avram sheep, cows, slaves, donkeys and camels. Then they went up to the Negev with his wife, everything he owned and Lot. He was very rich in cattle, silver and gold. His nephew Lot also had herds of animals, there were so many animals of Lot and his uncle, that grass and water were not enough for everyone; uncle and nephew made a deal: they decided to separate to look for food for their animals, Lot went to a very good place, where there was plenty of grass and water for his animals: a valley near the city of Sodom and Avram stayed to live in the land of Canaan. Time passed and Avram left that place and went to live somewhere else; a few years later there was a war between several kings and his nephew was taken prisoner of war, along with the people of the place where he lived; When Avram learned what happened to his nephew, he left with 318 men, he faced the kings and chased them, This is how he recovered his nephew, all his property and the people taken prisoner with him.

## **BERESHIT / GENESIS 12: 1-5**

- 1 Now YAHWEH said to Avram: 'Go out of your country, away from your family and away from your father's house, and go to the land that I will show you.
- 2 I will make you a great nation, I will bless you, I will magnify your name; and you will be blessed.
- 3 I will bless those who bless you, but I will curse whoever curses you; and by you all the tribes of the earth will be blessed.'
- 4 So Avram went out, as YAHWEH had told him, and Lot went with him. Avram was 75 years old when he left Haran.
- 5 Avram took his wife Sarai, Lot the son of his brother, and all his possessions which they had accumulated, as well as the people they had acquired in Haran; then they went out to the land of Kenaan and entered the land of Kenaan.

## **BERESHIT / GENESIS 13: 1-6, 8-12**

- 1 Avram went up from Mitzrayim - he, his wife and everything he had, and Lot with him - to the Negev.
- 2 Avram became rich, with a lot of cattle, silver and gold.
- 3 While he was on his trips to the Negev, he arrived in Beit-El, the place where his store had been at the beginning, between Beit-El and Ai,
- 4 when he had first built the altar; and there Avram invoked the Name of YAHWEH.
- 5 Lot, who was traveling with Avram, also had herds, herds and tents.
- 6 But the earth was not big enough for them to live together, because their possessions were very great and they could not dwell together.
- 8 Avram said to Lot: 'Please, we are not going to have quarrels between you and me, or between my shepherds and yours, since we are relatives.
- 9 Isn't the whole earth before you? Please separate yourself from me - if you go to the left, I will go to the right; if you go to the right, I will go to the left.
- 10 Lot looked up and saw that the whole plain of the Yarden was well watered everywhere, before YAHWEH destroyed Sedom and Amora, like the paradise of YAHWEH, like the land of Mitzrayim in the direction of Tzoar.
- 11 And Lot chose the whole field around the Yarden for himself, and Lot traveled from the east; then they separated from each other.
- 12 Avram lived in the land of Kenaan, and Lot lived in a town in neighboring towns, and planted his tent Sedom

## **BERESHIT / GENESIS 14: 12, 14-16**

- 12 But as they left, they took Lot, the son of Avram's brother, and his possessions; since he lived in Sedom.
- 14 When Avram heard that Lot his brother had been taken captive, he numbered his servants who had been born in his house, 318 of them, and went in pursuit to Dan.
- 15 During the night he and his servants divided the forces against them, then they attacked and chased them to Hovah, which was at the left hand of Dammesek.
- 16 He recovered all the goods and brought back his brother Lot with his goods, along with the women and the other people.

## **BERESHIT / GENESIS 17: 1-7**

- 1 When Avram was 99 years old, YAHWEH appeared to Avram and said: 'I am El Shaddai, I will make my Covenant between You and Me, and I will increase your numbers greatly.'
- 3 Avram fell on his face, and Elohim continued to speak to him:
- 4 As for me, this is my Covenant with you: you will be the father of many nations.
- 5 Your name will no longer be Avram [an exalted father], but your name will be Avraham [father of many], because I have made you father of many nations.
- 6 I will make you very fruitful. I will make nations of you, kings will descend from you.
- 7 'I am establishing my Covenant between My Word and you, together with your zera after you, generation by generation, as a perpetual Covenant, of being Elohim for you and your zera after you.



# BRIT HADASHÁ

## MORDEKHAI (MARK) 3:1 – 4:20

Yahshúa began to teach by the lake again, but the crowd that had gathered around him was so large that he got on the boat that was in the lake and sat there, while the crowd stayed on the ground, on the water's edge.

He taught them many things in parables. In the course of his teachings, he told them: 'Listen! A farmer went out to sow his seeds.

While planting, some fell to the side of the road; and the birds came and ate them; others fell into rocky spaces, where there was not much land. She sprouted quickly; but when the sun came up, the young plants were burned with scorching heat and, since their roots were not deep, they dried up.

Other seeds fell among thorns, and they grew and drowned them; therefore, they did not produce any grain. But another seed fell on rich land and produced grain; it sprouted and grew, and gave a harvest of thirty, sixty, and up to a hundred times what had been sown.
