



WELCOME TO PARASHA #13 OF THE BEAUTIFUL TORAH:

SHEMOT OVERVIEW
'These are the names'... Shemot

Today, we are starting the 2nd book of the Torah, called Shemot, which means 'names' because the parsha starts with listing the names of all the children of Yisra'el (Israel) who went to Mitsrayim (Egypt). In English, the 2nd book of the Torah is called Exodus, which has a different meaning from the Hebrew. Exodus means 'a mass departure

of people' and is the main theme of the book of Shemot. The 1st book of the Torah, Bereishit (Genesis) ended with the 12 tribes of Yisra'el having moved to Mitsrayim with the help of their brother Yoseph to start a new life during the famine. Now we are going to continue our story a few generations later and learn about Mosheh (Moses) who is from the tribe of Lewi (Levi), and how he was called to lead the exodus of the 12 tribes of Yisra'el from Mitsrayim to Kena'an (Canaan).

Because each parsha is so rich in information, we will only be able to examine certain parts of each parsha per lesson. We do encourage parents and their children to do their own studies. In future years, we will fill in the pieces from each parsha that we did not cover previously.

We pray that you will be blessed as we begin our study in the 2nd book of the Torah.

Let's dig in!

SHEMOT / EXODUS 1:1-7

1 These are the names of the sons of Yisra'el who went to Mitzrayim along with Yahakov his father; each man with his family:

2 Reuven, Shimeon, Levi, Yahudáh,

- 3 Yissajar, Zevulun, Binyamin, 4 Dan, Naftali, Gad, and Asher.
- 5 All counted, there were seventy-five souls born of Yahakov; Yosef was already in Mitzrayim.

6 Yosef died, like all his brothers and all that generation.

7 The sons of Yisra'el were fruitful, they increased abundantly, multiplied and grew powerfully; the earth was filled with them

SHEMOT / EXODUS 2:1-10

1 A man from the Levi tribe took a woman also from the Levi tribe as his wife.

2 When she conceived and had a son, seeing how beautiful he was, she hid him for three months. °

3 When she could no longer hide it, she took a basket of papyrus, covered it with mud and pitch, put the child in it and put it among the cart on the river bank. °

4 His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen to him. °

5 Pharaoh's daughter went down to bathe in the river while her maids walked along the banks of the river. Seeing the basket between the railing, he sent his slaves to pick it up.

6 She opened it and looked inside, and there in front of her there was a child crying! Pharaoh's

daughter, moved with pity, said: 'This must be one of the sons of the Hebrews.'

7 At this point, his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter: 'Do you want me to go look for one of the Hebrew women to love the child for you?

8 Pharaoh's daughter answered, 'Yes, go.' So, the girl went and called the boy's own mother.

9 Pharaoh's daughter said to him, 'Take this child and nurse him for me, and I will pay you to do it.' So

the woman took the child and breastfed him.

10 Then, when the child had grown something, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter; and she began to raise him as her son. She called him Moshe [Sacado], explaining: 'Because I took him out of the water.'

SHEMOT / EXODUS 3:1-8

1 Now Moshe was taking care of the sheep of his father-in-law Yitro, the priest of Midyan. Guiding the herd to the extreme side of the desert, he reached Mount Elohim, Horev.

2 The Malaj of YAHWEH appeared to him in a burning fire from the middle of a bush. He looked and saw

that even though the bush was burning in fire, the bush was not burning.

3 Moshe said: 'I'm going to go there and see this surprising vision and see why the bush is not burning.' 4 When YAHWEH saw that he had gone to see, Elohim called him from the middle of the bush: 'Moshe! Moshe!' He replied: 'Here I am.' °

5 He said: 'Don't come any closer! Take your sandals off your feet, because the place where you are

standing is Kadosh earth.

6 I am the Elohim of your fathers,' He continued, 'the Elohim of Avraham, the Elohim of Yitzjak and the Elohim of Ya'akov.' Moshe bowed his face, because he was afraid to look at Elohim.

7 YAHWEH said: 'I have seen how my people are being oppressed in Mitzrayim and I have heard their cry

for the rescue of their mos, because I know the pain of them.

8 I have come down to rescue them from the Mitzrayimim, and bring them out of that land to a good and spacious land, a land that flows with milk and honey, the place of the Kenaani, Hitti, Emori, Perizi, Hivi and Yevusi.

SHEMOT / EXODO 4:1-7

1 Moses answered, 'But I am sure that they will not believe me, and they will not listen to what I say, because they will say: ' YAHWEH has not appeared to you.

2 YAHWEH replied: 'What's that in your hand?' And he said: 'A rod.'

3 He said, 'Càst it on earth!' And he threw it into the earth: He became a serpent, and Moshe retreated from it.

4 Then YAHWEH said to Moshe, 'Extend your hand and hold it by the tail.' He extended his hand and grabbed it, and it became a rod in his hand.

5 'This is for them to believe that YAHWEH, the Elohim of their parents, the Elohim of Avraham, the Elohim of Yitzjak and the Elohim of Ya'akov, has appeared to you!

6 In addition, YAHWEH said to him, 'Now put your hand on your breast.' He put his hand on his bosom; and when he took it out, his hand was leper, as white as snow. °

7 Then Elohim said, 'Now put your hand back on your bosom.' He put his hand back on his breast; and when he took it out, it was healthy like the rest of his body.

SHEMOT / EXODUS 5:1

1 After that, Moshe and Aharon came, and said to Pharaoh, 'Here is what YAHWEH, the Elohim of Yisra,' he says: 'Let my people go, so that they can celebrate a feast in the desert to honor me.

SHEMOT / EXODO 6:1

1 YAHWEH said to Moshe: 'Now you will see what I'm going to do to Pharaoh. With a powerful hand he will let them go; with force he will throw them out of the earth!





HILLEL (LUKE) 1:1-2:20

HILLEL 1:26-33

26 In the sixth month, the malaj Gavriel was sent by YAHWEH to a city in Galil, called Netzaret, 27 to a virgin committed to marry a man named Yosef, from the house of David; the name of the virgin was Miryam.

28 Approaching her, the malaj said: 'Shalom, favored woman! YAHWEH is with you!

29 She was deeply frightened by her words, and she was perplexed to think about what this greeting would mean.

30 The malaj said to him: 'Do not be afraid Miryam, for you have been favored by YAHWEH.
31 Look! You will conceive in your bosom, and give birth to a son, and you will call him Yahshhua.
32 He will be great, he will be called the Son of Ha Elyon. YAHWEH Elohim will give him the throne of his father David;

33 and will reign over the house of Yahakov forever; his kingdom will have no end.
