**WELCOME TO PARASHA #5 OF THE TORAH
JAYEI SARAH WHICH MEANS: THE LIFE OR YEARS OF SARAH**

Sarah lived one hundred and twenty-seven years. Upon his death, Abraham looks for a way to bury him and trades the cave of Machpelah for Hebron for a price of 400 shekels. Then Abraham looks for a wife for his son Yitzchak and sends his trusted servant to his land to take a wife from there from his family.

The servant goes and to be sure of choosing the right woman, he asks the Eternal that the maiden who will give him and his camels water to drink will be the one chosen for Yitzchak. Then, Rivkah appears, gives water to him and his camels, so the servant hurries to fulfill his mission and goes to Rivkah's house to talk to her family about the reason for his visit. The young woman agrees to go with

Abraham's servant to meet Yitzchak and be his wife. Abraham takes Keturah as his wife and has more children, but everything he had he gave to his son Yitzchak. Abraham dies at the age of one hundred and sixty-five, and his sons Yitzchaq and Yishmael buried him next to Sarah.

DEATH OF SARAH

BERESHIT / GENESIS 23: 1-4, 16-19

- 1 Sarah lived to be 127 years old; these were the years of Sarah's life.
- 2 Sarah died at Kiryat-Arba, also known as Hevron, in the land of Kenaan; And Avraham came to mourn Sarah and to mourn her.
- 3 Then he arose from before his dead man, and said to the sons of Heth,
- 4 'I am a stranger living in a foreign land with you; Let me have a burial place among you, so that I can bury my dead wife.'
- 16 When Avraham realized what Ephron had said, he weighed for Ephron the amount of money he had specified in the presence of the sons of Heth, 400 shekels of silver of the weight accepted among the merchants [ten pounds].
- 17 Thus the field of Ephron in Machpelah, which is next to Mamre—the field, its cave, and all the trees in it and around it—were inscribed to
- 18 Avraham as his possession in the presence of the sons of Heth who belonged to the governing council of the city.
- 19 Then Avraham buried his wife Sarah in the cave in the field of Machpelah, near Mamre, also known as Hevron, in the land of Kenaan.

A WIFE FOR YITZJAK

BERESHIT / GENESIS 24: 1-4, 11-19, 23-27

- 1 Now Avraham was old, advanced in years; and YAHWEH had blessed Avraham in everything.
- 2 Avraham said to the servant who had served him the longest, who was in charge of all that he possessed, 'Put your hand under my thigh;
- 3 For I want you to swear by the LORD, the Elohim of heaven and the Elohim of the earth, that you will not choose a wife for my son from among the women of Kenaan, among whom I am dwelling;
- 4 But you shall go to my land, where I was born, and to my tribe, and you shall take from there a wife for my son Yitzchak.'
- Then the servant took ten of his master's camels and all kinds of gifts from his master with him, and got up and went to Aram-Naharayim, to the city of Nahor.
- 11 Toward evening, when the women go out to draw water, he made the camels kneel outside the city by the well.
- 12 He said, 'YAHWEH, Elohim of my master Avraham, please let me succeed today; and show your grace to my master Avraham.
- 13 Here I am, standing by the fountain of water, while the daughters of the men of the people go out to draw water.
- 14 I will say to one of the virgins, 'Please put down your pitcher, so that I can drink.' If she answers, 'Yes, baby; and I will give water to your camels also,' then let it be the one you have destined for your servant Yitzchak. That is how I will know that you have shown favor to my master.'
- 15 Before he had finished speaking, Rebecca the daughter of Bethuel, son of Milkah, the wife of Nahor the brother of Abraham, came out with her jar on her shoulder.
- 16 The virgin was very pretty, a virgin, she had never had sexual relations with any man. She went down to the water fountain, filled her pitcher, and went up.
- 17 The servant ran to meet her and said, 'Please give me some water from your pitcher to drink.'
- 18 'Drink, my lord,' she answered, and immediately lowered the pitcher into his hands and let him drink.
- 19 until she stopped drinking, and she said, 'And I will draw water for your camels until they have drunk to their heart's content.'
- 23 And he asked her, 'Whose daughter are you? Tell me, please. Is there room in your father's house for us to spend the night?'
- 24 She answered, 'I am the daughter of Bethuel, the son whom Milkah bore to Nahor.'
- 25 adding, 'We have plenty of straw and fodder and room for them to spend the night.'
- 26 The man was well pleased, bowed his head and bowed down before Yahweh.
- 27 Then he said, 'Blessed be Yahweh, the Elohim of my master Abraham, who has not forsaken his faithful love for my master; for Yahweh has led me to the house of my master's relatives.'

DEATH OF AVRAHAM

BERESHIT / GENESIS 25: 1-2, 5-10

- 1 Avraham took another wife, whose name was Keturah.
- 2 She gave birth to Zimran, Yokshan, Medan, Midyan, Yishbak, and Shuach.
- 5 Avraham gave all that he owned to Yitzchak as an inheritance.
- 6 But to the sons of the concubines he gave gifts while he was still alive and sent them east to the land of Kedem, far from Yitzchak his son.
- 7 And this was how long Avraham lived, 175 years.
- 8 Then Avraham breathed his last, dying at a ripe old age, an old man full of years; And he was gathered to his people.
- 9 Yitzchak and his sons Yishmael buried him in the cave of Machpelah, in the field of Ephron the son of Tzochar the Hitti, near Mamre.
- 10 the field that Avraham bought from the sons of Heth. Avraham was buried there with his wife Sarah.



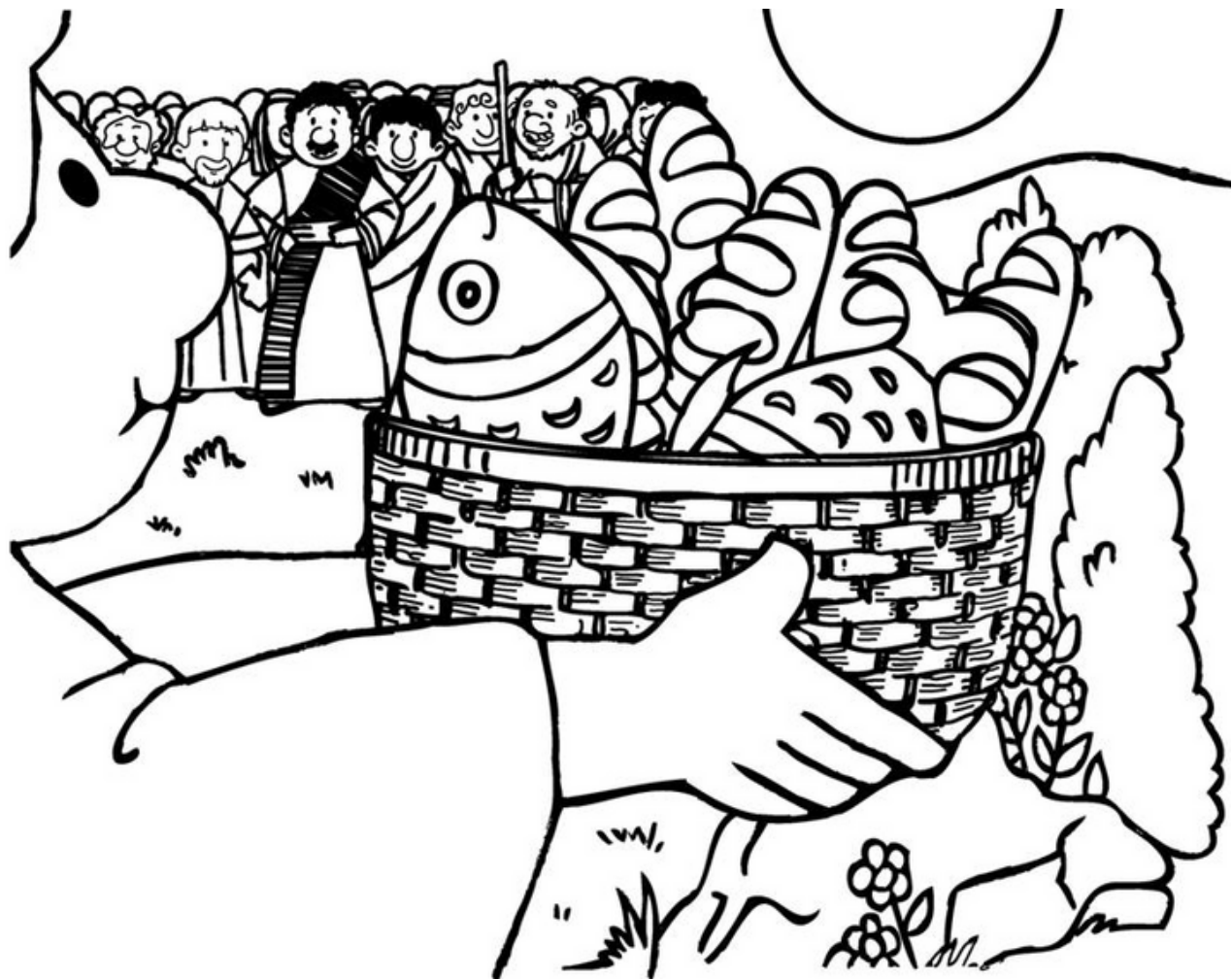
BRIT HADASHÁ

It was about this time that another crowd gathered, and they had nothing to eat.
