**WELCOME TO PARASHA #6 OF THE TORAH:  
TOLDOT THAT MEANS GENERATIONS**

This parasha Yitzjaq and Rivkah were very happy and expected to have children, but Rivkah could not have children; however, they trusted the Eternal and prayed asking for a miracle.

Time passed and they continued to pray with confidence that they would receive the response from YHWH, but after twenty years Rivkah received the miracle of getting pregnant. Inside Rivkah's belly she felt as if something was happening, as if there were fights, and asked the Eternal about what was happening and the answer was that there were two nations in her belly and that the two would be very big.

Rivkah gave birth to two children, the first was reddish and with hairs all over his body and they called him Esau, and the second came out with his little hand grabbing his brother's heel, and he was called Yaaqov.

Esau was a hunter and brought animals home, prepared the meat and gave it to his father. Yaaqov liked to dedicate himself to the profession of grazing his father's flocks, he meditated a lot on the things of the Creator and remained aware of his parents. In this parasha we will learn the story of what happened to these two brothers and what they had to do to achieve their father's blessing before he died.

## BERESHIT / GENESIS 25: 19-34

19 Here is the story of Yitzjak, Avraham's son. Avraham begat Yitzjak.  
20 Yitzjak was forty years old when he took Rivkah, the daughter of Betuel the Arami of Paddam-Aram and sister of Lavan the Arami, to be his wife.  
21 Yitzjak prayed to YAHWEH for his wife because she was sterile. YAHWEH listened to his prayer, and Rivkah conceived.  
22 The children fought with each other inside her so much that she said: 'If it's going to be like that with me, why is this to me?' So she went to consult YAHWEH,  
23 who answered him, 'There are two nations in your womb. From birth they will be two rival peoples. One of these peoples will be stronger than the other, and the largest will serve the minor.  
24 When the time to give birth came, there were twins in his womb.  
25 The first to come out was reddish and covered on all sides with hair, like a skin; and they named him Esav  
26 Then his brother emerged, with his hand grabbing Esav's heel, so he was named Ya'akov Yitzjak was sixty years old when she had them.  
27 The children grew up; and Esav became a skilled hunter, a mountain man; while Yahakov was a still man who stood in the tents.  
28 Yitzjak favored Esav, because he had a taste for the deer; Rivkah favored Ya'akov.  
29 One day when Ya'akov had cooked a stew, Esav came from the open field, exhausted,  
30 and said to Ya'akov: 'Please! Let me swallow some of that red thing - that red thing! I'm exhausted! (That's why he was called Edom [red].)  
31 Ya'akov replied: 'First, sell me your firstborn rights this day.'  
32 'Look, I'm about to die!' Esav said. 'What use will my birth rights have for me?'  
33 Ya'akov said: 'First swear to me!' So he swore to him, thus selling the birthrights to Ya'akov.  
34 Then Yahakov gave him bread and lentil stew, he ate and drank, and stood up and went on his way. This is how Esav showed how little he valued his firstness.

## BERESHIT / GENESIS 27: 1-10, 14-17, 19-26, 30-35

1 Over time, after Yitzjak had grown old and his eyes clouded, unable to see, he called Esav his eldest son, and said to him: 'My son?' And he replied: 'Here I am.' And he said:  
2 'Look, now I'm old, I don't know when I'll die.  
3 Therefore, please take your hunting suit - your arrow of arrows and your bow; go out into the field, and bring deer.  
4 Make me meat, as I like; and bring it to me to eat. Then I will bless you [as a firstborn], before I die.  
5 Rivkah was listening when Yitzjak spoke to his son Esav. So when Esav went out to the field to hunt veno for his father and bring him back,  
6 she said to her son Ya'akov: 'Listen! I heard your father say to your brother Esav:  
7 'Bring me deer and do it the way I like it, so I can eat it. Then I will give you my blessing in the presence of YAHWEH, before I die.  
8 Now pay attention to me, my son; and do what I tell you.  
9 Go to the herd, and bring two first-class kids. I will make them in good taste for your father, the way he likes it;  
10 and you will take your father to eat; so he will give his blessing to you before he dies.  
14 So he went, he took them and brought them to his mother; and his mother prepared them in good taste in the way that his father loved.  
15 Then Rivkah took the best clothes of Esav, his eldest son, which he had with her in the house, and put them on Yahakov, his youngest son;  
16 and he put the skins of the kids on his hands and on the part of his neck that had no hair.  
17 Then she gave her son Ya'akov the tasty food and the bread she had prepared.  
19 Ya'akov said to his father, 'I am Esav, your firstborn. I have done what you asked me to do. Get up, sit down, eat the deer, and give me your blessing.  
20 Yitzjak said to his son: 'How did you find him so quickly, my son?' He replied: 'YAHWEH your Elohim made it happen that way.'  
21 Yitzjak said to Yah'akov, 'Come here, near me, to be able to touch you, my son, and to know if you are in fact my son Esav or not.'  
22 Ya'akov approached his father Yitzjak, who touched him, and said, 'The voice is Ya'akov's voice, but the hands are Esav's hands.'  
23 However, he did not detect him, because his hands were hairy as those of his brother Esav; so he gave him the blessing.  
24 He asked: 'Are you really my son Esav?' And he replied: 'I am.'  
25 He said, 'Bring him here, to eat my son's deer, so I can give you my blessing.'  
26 Then his father Yitzjak said to him, 'Come now, and kiss me, my son.'  
30 But as soon as Yitzjak had finished giving his blessing to Yah'akov, when Yahakov had barely left his father's presence, Esav his brother came from his hunt.  
31 He had also prepared a tasty flesh and brought it to his father, and now he said to his father: 'My father get up and eat from his son's deer, so that you can give me your blessing.'  
32 Yitzjak his father told him: 'Who are you?' And he replied: 'I am your son, your firstborn, Esav.'  
33 Yitzjak began to tremble uncontrollably, and said: 'So, who prepared deer and brought it to me? I ate everything just before you came, and I gave him my blessing. That's the truth, and the blessing will remain.  
34 When Esav heard his father's words, he broke into a tall, bitter sob: 'Father, bless me too,' he begged.  
35 He answered: 'Your brother came deceptively and took your blessing.'
