WELCOME TO PARASHA #7 OF THE TORAH:
VAYETSÉ WHICH MEANS: AND HE CAME OUT

Yaaqov sleeps in Bet El, on the way to Paran. He dreams of a ladder going up to heaven with angels going up and down. Elohim appears to him in a dream and blesses him.

Yaaqov meets Rachel, Lavan's daughter, at the well where she used to water the sheep. Laván agrees with Yaaqov to give Rajel as his wife in payment for 7 years of work. At the end of the term he cheats on him and gives him Lea, the older sister.

He will work another 7 years for Rachel. Yaakov negotiates with Lavan for an appropriate salary. Yaaqov accumulates a fortune in sheep and cattle.

After another 6 years, he decides with his wife to get away from Laván. Noticing their escape, Laván goes after them. Elohim warns him not to harm them. The final encounter between Yaaqov and Laván takes place, who sign a non-aggression pact, separate, Yaaqov arriving at the limit of Canaan.

BERESHIT / GENESIS 28: 10-22

10 Ya'akov left Be'er-Sheva and traveled toward Haran.

11 He came to a certain place and stayed there the night, because the sun had set. He took a stone from the place, put it under his head and lay there to sleep.

12 He dreamed that there before him was a ladder resting on the earth and with its end reaching to heaven, and ADONAI's angels were going up and down it.

13 Then suddenly ADONAI was standing there next to him; and He said: 'I am YAHWEH the Elohim of Avraham your father [grandfather] and the Elohim of Yitzchak. Do not fear, The Earth on which you are lying I will give it to you and your offspring.'

14 Your seed will be as numerous as the grains of sand on the earth. You will expand to the west and to the east, to the north and to the south. For you and your offspring all the tribes of the earth will be blessed.

15 Look, I am with you. I will keep you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land, for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you.'

16 Ya'akov woke up from his sleep, and said, 'Surely ADONAI is in this place—and I didn't know it!'

17 Then he was afraid, and said: 'This place is afraid! This has to be the house of Elohim! This is heaven's gate!'

18 Ya'akov got up early in the morning, took the stone that was under his head, set it up as a marker stone, and poured olive oil on it.

19 and he called the place Beit-El [house of Elohim]; but the town had originally been called Luz.

20 Ya'akov made this vow: 'If ADONAI Elohim is with me and keeps me on this road that I am traveling, giving me bread to eat and clothes to wear,

21 so that I return to my father's house in Shalom, then ADONAI will be my Elohim;

22 And this stone, which I have set as a marker stone, shall be the house of Elohim; and of all that You give me, I will faithfully return a tenth part to you.'

BERESHIT / GENESIS 29: 1-6, 10-30

1 And Ya'akov began, and went to the land of the east to Lavan, the son of Betuel el Arami and the brother of Rivkah, mother of Ya'akov and Esav.

2 As he looked he saw a well in the field; and there were three flocks of sheep lying there by him; because they gave the sheep to drink from that well. The stone at the mouth of the well was large,

3 And only when all the flocks had gathered there did they roll the stone from the mouth of the well and water the sheep. Then they would put the stone back in its place over the mouth of the well.

4 Ya'akov said to them, 'My brothers, where are you from?' They replied: 'We are from Haran.'

5 He asked them, 'Do you know Lavan the son [grandson] of Nahor?' They said: 'We know him.'

6 He asked them, 'Are things going well with him?' 'Yes,' they answered, 'and here comes his daughter Rachel with the sheep.'

10 When Ya'akov saw Rachel the daughter of Lavan his mother's brother, and the sheep of Lavan his mother's brother, Ya'akov went up and rolled the stone from the mouth of the well and gave her the sheep of Lavan to drink. They wash their mother's brother.

11 Ya'akov kissed Rachel and wept aloud.

12 Ya'akov told Rachel that he was a relative of his father, and that he was the son of Rivkah; and she ran and reported it to her father according to these words.

13 When Lavan heard the news about Ya'akov her sister's son, he ran to meet him, hugged him and kissed him, and brought him to her house. Ya'akov told Lavan everything that had happened.

14 Lavan said to him, 'You are indeed my own flesh and blood.' After Ya'akov had stayed with him for a whole month,

15 Lavan said to him, 'Why should you work for me for nothing, just because you are my relative? Tell me how much I should pay you.'

16 Now Lavan had two daughters; the name of the eldest was Leah, and the name of the youngest was Rachel.

17 Leah's eyes were dim; but Rachel was good-looking, with beautiful features.

18 Ya'akov had fallen in love with Rachel, and he said, 'I will work for you for seven years in exchange for Rachel your youngest daughter.'

19 Lavan replied, 'It is better that I give it to you than to another; stay with me.'

20 So Ya'akov worked seven years for Rachel, and it seemed to him only a few days, because he was so in love with her.

21 Ya'akov said to Lavan, 'Give me my wife, since my time is over, so that he can start living with her.'

22 Lavan gathered all the men of the place and gave a marriage banquet.

23 In the night he took her daughter Leah from her and brought her to Ya'akov, and he went in and slept with her.

24 Lavan also gave his slave girl Zilpah to his daughter Leah as his slave.

25 In the morning Ya'akov saw that he was with Leah, and he said to Lavan, 'What kind of thing is this that you have done to me? Didn't I work for you because of Rachel? Why have you deceived me?'

26 Lavan replied, 'In our place this is not how it is done, to give the youngest daughter before the firstborn.'

27 Finish this one's wedding week, and we'll give you the other week as well in exchange for the work you'll do for me for yet another seven years.'

28 Ya'akov agreed to this, so he finished his week, and Lavan gave him his daughter Rachel as his wife.

29 Lavan also gave his daughter Rachel his slave Bilhah as his slave.

30 So not only Ya'akov went and slept with Rachel, but he loved Rachel more than Leah. He then he served Lavan for another seven years.

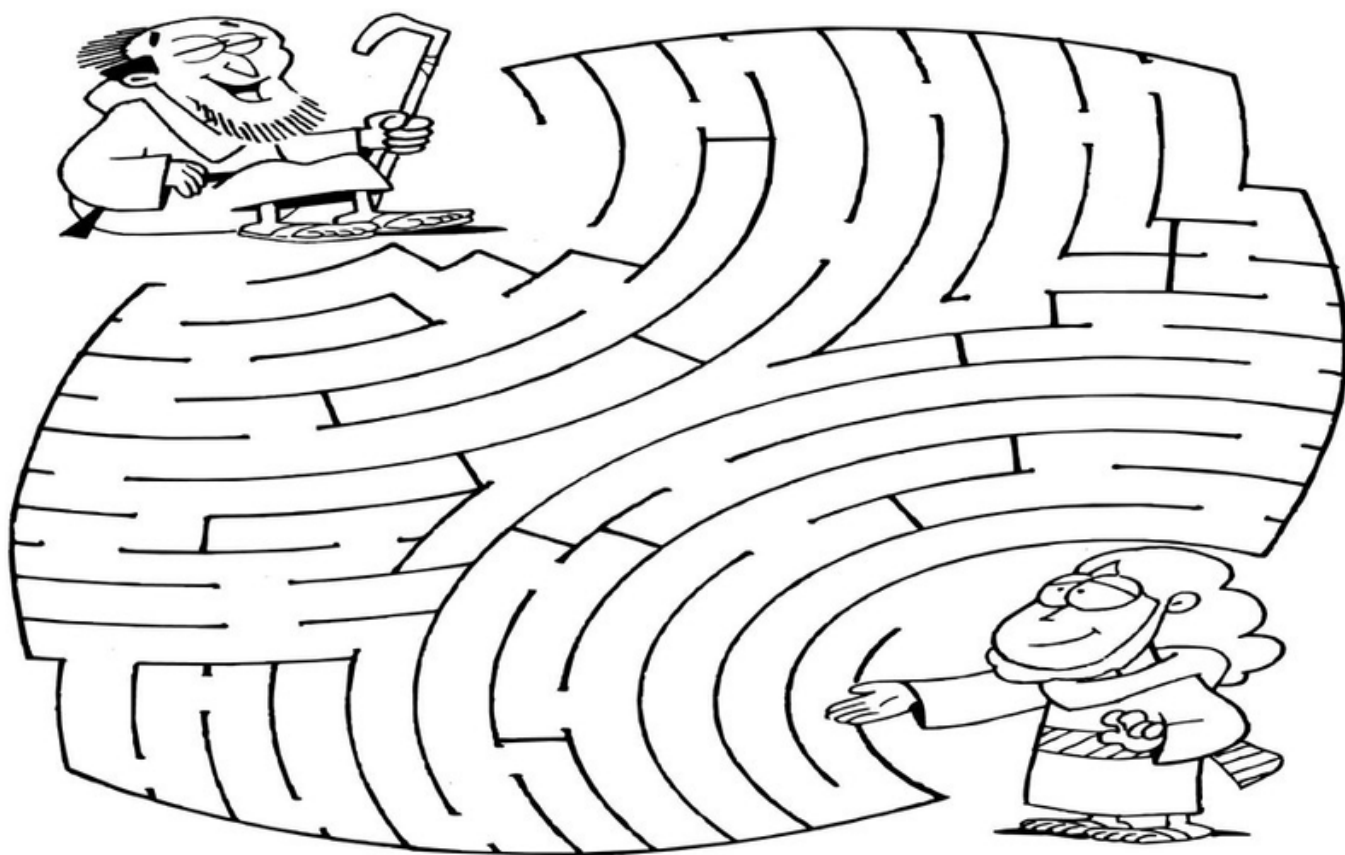
MORDEKHAI (MARCOS) 10:32 – 11:33
