IN THIS PARASHA WE WILL SEE HOW MOSHE, AFTER BRINGING THE SECOND TABLETS, GATHERED THE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL TO EXPLAIN TO THEM THE IMPORTANT TASK THEY HAD TO CARRY OUT.

THE DAY OF SHABBAT - Shemot 35

1 Moshe gathered all the congregation of the children of Isra'el, and said to them, 'These are the things that ADONAI has commanded you to do:

2 In six days you will work, but the seventh day will be a Kadosh day for you, a Shabbat of complete rest in honor of YAHWEH. Anyone who does any work on it will be put to death. °

3 They shall not light a fire in any of their houses on Shabbat.'

THE OFFERING FOR THE MISHKAN - Shemot 35

4 Moshe said to all the congregation of the sons of Isra'el, 'Here is what ADONAI has commanded:

5 'Take a collection for ADONAI from among yourselves – anyone whose heart makes him willing to bring an offering to ADONAI: gold, silver and bronze;

6 blue, purple and scarlet thread; fine linen, goat hair,

7 dyed ram skins and thin skin; acacia wood;

8 oil for light, spices for anointing oil and for fragrant incense;

9 emerald stones and stones to be mounted, for the ephod and the oracle. °



THE WORK OF THE MISHKAN - Shemot 35

- 10 'Then let all the craftsmen among you come and do everything that ADONAI has commanded:
- 11 the Tabernacle with its tent, covering, clasps, boards, crossbars, posts and bases;
- 12 the Ark with its poles, the cover of the Ark and the curtain to cover it;
- 13 the table with its poles, all its utensils and the bread of the presence;
- 14 the menorah for the light with its utensils and lamps, and the oil for the light;
- 15 the altar of incense with its sticks; the anointing oil; the fragrant incense; the screen for the entrance of the Tabernacle;
- 16 the altar for burnt offerings, with its poles and all its utensils; the pile with its base;
- 17 the rugs for the patio, with their posts and bases; the screen for the patio entrance;
- 18 the tent pegs for the Tabernacle; the stakes for the yard, with their strings;
- 19 the vestments to officiate, to serve in the Makon Kadosh Place; and the Kadoshim garments for Aharon the cohen and the garments for his sons, so that they may serve in the office of cohen."

THE PEOPLE BRING THE OFFERING - Shemot 35

- 20 Then all the congregation of the children of Isra'el withdrew from Moshe's presence;
- 21 and they came, all whose hearts were willing and all whose spirits were willing, and they brought offerings to YAHWEH for the work in the Tabernacle of the Testimony, for the service and for the Kadoshim vestments.
- 22 Both men and women came, all with willing hearts; they brought nose rings, earrings, rings, belts, all kinds of gold jewelry – they all brought a gold offering to YAHWEH.

CONSTRUCTION OF THE MISHKAN - Shemot 36

- 1 'Betzalel and Aholiav, together with all the craftsmen whom YAHWEH had endowed with the necessary wisdom and skill to do the work needed for the Kadosh Place, will do exactly according to all that YAHWEH has commanded.'
- 8 All the skilled men among them who did the work made the Tabernacle, using ten curtains of fine finely woven linen and of blue, purple, and scarlet thread. They made them with embroidered keruvim that had been made by skilled craftsmen.
- 20 he made the upright boards for the Tabernacle of acacia wood.
- 21 Each board was fifteen feet long and two and a quarter feet wide.
- 22 There were two projections on each board, and the boards were joined together. This is how he made all the boards for the Tabernacle.
- 31 He made crossbars of acacia wood, five for the boards on one side of the Tabernacle,
- 32 five crossbars for the boards on the other side of the Tabernacle, and five crossbars for the boards on the other side of the Tabernacle at the back toward the west.
- 33 He made the crossbar in the middle so that it extended from one end of the boards to the other, in the middle.
- 34 He overlaid the boards with gold, made gold rings for them through which the crossbars passed, and overlaid the crossbars with gold.

MISHKAN FURNITURE - Shemot 37

- 1 Betzalel made the Ark of acacia wood three and three quarter feet long, two and a quarter feet wide, and two and a quarter feet high.
- 2 he overlaid it with pure gold inside and out and put a gold molding around the top.
- 3 He cast four gold rings for its four legs, two rings on each side.
- 4 He made poles of acacia wood and overlaid them with gold.
- 5 He put the poles to carry the Ark into the rings on the sides of the Ark.
- 6 He made a cover for the Ark of pure gold, three and three-quarter feet long and two and a quarter feet wide.
- 7 he made two keruvim of gold; he made them hammered for the two ends of the cover of the Ark. –

HE ATRIUM - Shemot 38

- 9 He made the patio. On the south side, facing south, the patio rugs were made of finely woven linen, 150 feet long,
- 10 supported on twenty posts on twenty bronze bases; the hooks on the posts and the attached rings for hanging were silver.

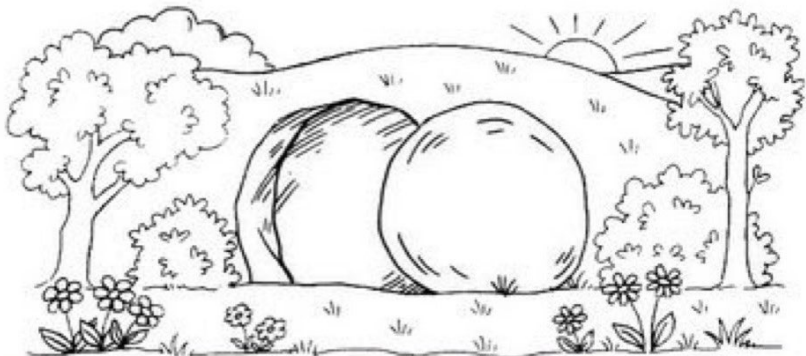
But on the first day of the week, while it was still very early, they took the spices they had prepared, went to the tomb, and found the stone removed from the tomb!
