Enduring Understanding(s)	The obstacles individuals face today based upon their race, religion, gender or sexual identity are a result of long-standing structures created over many centuries by individuals and like-minded groups.
	In a society built upon multiple, overlapping systems of hierarchy and privilege, opportunity, representation, and access are unequally distributed to individuals.
	These systems of hierarchy influence all aspects of our daily lives, from access to safe spaces, clean water, access to good, affordable housing and health services, and who or what gets represented in the media.
	This <u>unequal distribution</u> is based upon value assumptions frequently (but not always) made by individuals and groups not belonging to the same group as those most affected.
Potential Misconceptions	<u>Power, Opportunity, Access, and Representation</u> are equally shared by all within society.
	The intersections of the systems of patriarchy, <u>capitalism</u> , settler <u>colonialism</u> , and <u>white supremacy</u> in America mean that one cannot treat all individuals in America as a monolithic block, with similar

A4454 mandates public schools teach lessons on sexual orientation and gender identity starting in kindergarten.







Transgender Student Guidance for School Districts

2. Student-Centered Approach

A school district shall accept a student's asserted gender identity; <u>parental consent is not required</u>. Further, <u>a student need not meet any threshold diagnosis</u> or treatment requirements to have his or her gender identity recognized and respected by the district, school or school personnel. Nor is a legal or court-ordered name change required. <u>There is no affirmative duty for any school district personnel to notify a student's parent or guardian of the student's gender identity or expression.</u>



Transgender Student Guidance for School Districts

There may be instances where a parent or guardian of a minor student disagrees with the student regarding the name and pronoun to be used at school and in the student's education records. A parent or guardian may object to the minor student's name change request. School districts should consult their board attorney regarding the minor student's civil rights and protections under the NJLAD. Staff should continue to refer to the student in accordance with the student's chosen name and pronoun at school and may consider providing resource information regarding family counseling...

School districts should be mindful of disputes between minor students and parents concerning the student's gender identity or expression.
