How to Register to Vote

There are four ways to register to vote in New Hampshire. Each requires proof of identity, age, citizenship, and where you live.

Register to vote at the Westmoreland Clerk's office up to 6-13 days before any election

- The town clerk's office is at the Westmoreland Town Hall at 780 Route 63, Westmoreland, NH 03467, telephone: 603-399-7211, email: town.clerk@westmorelandnh.gov
- The town clerk's office hours are
 - Tuesday 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM and
 - Wednesday 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM

Register to vote with your local Supervisors of the Checklist

- Supervisors of the Checklist meet in 2026 at: 10:00 AM, 1 September in the Westmoreland Town Hall and,
- These times are posted at the Town Hall and Westmoreland Post Office ten days prior to meeting days.

Register to vote on the day of any election, at the polling place

- New Hampshire allows eligible voters to register at the polling place on Election Day. Voters registering on Election Day should bring documentation proving identity, age, citizenship, and domicile. Voters who lack documentary proof of citizenship can also attest to their citizenship using a qualified voter affidavit.
- This will take extra time. Look for the **voter registration table**.

Register absentee, by mail

- Voters who are unable to register in person because of physical disability, religious reasons, military service, or absence from their town, may register by mail. "Disability" includes people with health circumstances who are advised by medical authorities to avoid going out in public. This includes voters with symptoms of a communicable disease or illness and those who, because of their own health circumstances, limit public exposure in their day-to-day life as a preventative measure.
- Request an absentee voter registration packet from the Westmoreland Town Clerk.
- The absentee voter registration form must be witnessed by another person. Both forms are to be returned to the Westmoreland Town Clerk.

How to Vote

Voting In Person

- Polling place location:
 - State Primary Election – September 8, 2026 in the Westmoreland Town Hall, 780 Route 63, Westmoreland, NH, 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM
 - General Election – November 3, 2026 in the Westmoreland School, 40 Glebe Road, Westmoreland, NH, 8:00 to 7: 00 PM
 - Town Election - March 9, 2027 in the Westmoreland School, 40 Glebe Road, Westmoreland, NH, 7:00 PM to completed
 - Alternate Town Election – May 11, 2027 in the Westmoreland School, 40 Glebe Road, Westmoreland, NH, 7:00 PM to completed
- Voter photo ID requirements: New Hampshire voters must show an approved photo ID to receive a ballot. If a voter does not present an approved photo ID and their identity is not verified by an election official, they will not be allowed to vote.

Voting By Absentee Ballot (Restricted)

- By New Hampshire law, all residents who will be absent from the town during the hours the polls are open on election day, or residents with disabilities or illness, religious reasons, or work hours that keep them from getting to the polls, are eligible to vote absentee. "Disability" includes people with health circumstances who are advised by medical authorities to avoid going out in public. This includes voters with symptoms of a communicable disease or illness and those who, because of their own health circumstances, limit public exposure in their day-to-day life as a preventative measure. "Work hours" includes care of the infirm and children, whether paid or unpaid.
- Absentee ballots are available from the Westmoreland Town Clerk approximately 30 days before an election. Request the absentee ballot application from the Town Clerk or download the application online up to 6 months before an election. You must request an absentee ballot for every election. If you wish, you may submit a request in writing that should include all the information required on the application: your name, voting address, mailing address and your signature.
- An application for an absentee ballot may be returned in person or by mail, fax, or email to the Westmoreland Town Clerk, provided there is an actual (NOT electronic) signature.
 - When applying, registered voters must verify their identity in one of these ways:
 - Include a copy of a qualifying photo ID with your application OR

- Have your application notarized (electronic notarization is acceptable) OR
 - Present a qualifying photo ID in person to the Westmoreland Town Clerk before the ballot is issued.
- The absentee voter registration form must be witnessed by another person. Both forms are to be returned to the Westmoreland Town Clerk during normal office hours:
 - Tuesday 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM and
 - Wednesday 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM

Upcoming Election Dates

- Upcoming election dates and the poll hours:
 - State Primary Election – September 8, 2026 in the Westmoreland Town Hall, 780 Route 63, Westmoreland, NH, 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM
 - General Election – November 3, 2026 in the Westmoreland School, 40 Glebe Road, Westmoreland, NH, 8:00 to 7: 00 PM
 - Town Election - March 9, 2027 in the Westmoreland School, 40 Glebe Road, Westmoreland, NH, 7:00 PM to completed
 - Alternate Town Election – May 11, 2027 in the Westmoreland School, 40 Glebe Road, Westmoreland, NH, 7:00 PM to completed
- General election information:
 - Town elections are held (the second Tuesday of March and the Alternate Town Election, if needed, is the second Tuesday of May)
 - Primaries for state-wide and Congressional elections are held in even-numbered years, the second Tuesday of September.
 - State-wide and Congressional elections are held in even-numbered years, on the Tuesday after the first Monday of November. Presidential elections are held every four years, on the same day.
 - Presidential primaries are held early in the year of the Presidential election, at a date to be determined by the NH Secretary of State.
