## Formal Recommendations to the Selectboard from the Committee

- 1. Bid out the transportation (Trucking)
- 2. Explore outsourcing operations of the Recycle Center for 2023
- 3. Raise sticker price from current \$10 to \$25 (interim while exploring per bag charges)
- 4. Increase demo costs to the highest comparable on matrix (Vicki drafting chart)
- 5. Prohibit Asphalt/shingles at collection site
- 6. Require material being disposed of to be included on the receipts

#### Follow up discussion on waste handle compared to Gilsum and Walpole

Westmoreland co-mingle accepts plastics 1-7; Walpole segregates plastic; # 1-2 have value

Co-mingle in Westmoreland container contains a lot of aluminum – this is lost \$\$\$ - education is key

- What happens when material is shipped to Rutland (what does separation look like)?
- What if we collected 1 & 2 only added, co-mingle segregation, other plastics could become demo material

Opportunity for additional paper segregation – separation of newspaper from magazines

Walpole investments have paid off in ability to generate income; 6-8 volunteers at each station

Joanne contacted Gilsum - Monadnock Truck provides all materials including bags, as well as managing any fees – cost is \$21K per year which includes person that works there.

# **Suggestions from Ron:**

Refrigerants:

AC/humidifiers – someone comes to drain the units and we get paid \$15 for one of those items

Stacking cardboard is big improvement – sometimes challenge is material will slide forward

Traffic flow and speed were mentioned as a challenge

- idea of maybe a snow fence to create one way in, one way out
- For speed write down plate and report

Current container placement allows for usage of space behind containers for truck to get in and turn around when taking containers

- Is there a different way to place containers that could support the removal and placement and allow for additional space utilization on the property?

Does Ron have any insight on what he thinks he can do to support the objectives of his role, and what he needs to support him in his role?
