## Amy - Education

Spoke with Tara Albert – She does not offer outreach training for general public. Their training is for solid waste operators of the collection sites. Please see below from email:

## <u>Vicki – Community Farm update</u>

Antioch had composting but people bring non-composting materials. They ended up taking the materials to the pig farm – Archway farm; this would be an all give – no take option and would be complicated for town to collect. Do not recommend that but it is educational information that can be communicated in a newsletter.

City compost – Keene – they provide containers to customers for a fee and pick up at a frequency. At some point this option allows for getting some back. Pricing has been requested, # of households may determine cost options.

Education around how the reduction of compacted trash (if bag fee) - this may be an option residents would like to opt for to help reduce disposal costs.

## Follow-up discussions:

Gilsum Board of selectman called back related to Monadnock Trans. – cost is approx. \$2K

- Used to be 2 days a week, now just Saturdays it is going well. They had one event where someone dumped by the entrance. They had game camera that captured who it was and was dealt with
- Reduced disposal from 20 tons to 5 tons (not sure of the frequency). They have ability to transport and combine at the Monadnock facility in Jaffrey where they send on to Auburn or Millbury, MA
- Town has not responded related to scope of work for bidding purposes

#### <u>Newsletter</u>

Items to be included in a newsletter – interim measures:

- Tin cans rinsed clean can go with scrap metal fills in gaps, better rate of pay, bigger return
- Aluminum cans compact the cans link to can crushers people could purchase to use at their homes
