HOW TO CONDUCT YOUR OWN RESEARCH ON LOT HISTORY

It is likely you can find the information you need to answer your questions by reviewing the records already available to you. NH realtors, state and municipal agencies, and citizens routinely use the following sources of information and internet websites to develop lot history information.

 Septic and Subdivision file information for parcels can be found on the NH DES Subsurface Systems Bureau website. Approval dates and designer and installer information can be found at: <u>http://www2.des.state.nh.us/OneStop/Subsurface Application Approval Query.aspx</u>

• Check with the town in which the parcel is located. The towns receive copies of all NH DES approved subdivisions and septic systems.

• The Municipal Tax Assessor's Office or Building Department in your city/town house the building permits for each structure. These will have the septic system approval numbers printed directly on them.

• The County Registry of Deeds Office (<u>www.nhdeeds.com</u>) has "chain of ownership" information which will help NH DES determine who owned the parcel of land and when. As many of our records are listed by "owner", this is important information, especially for those systems or subdivisions that were approved prior to 1986. These NH counties have records available on-line. (Wait for the link to open fully.)

• Check with the previous owner of the property. They may have historical information that is not found in any record.

ABOUT STATE SUBSURFACE SYSTEMS RECORDS

The Subsurface Systems law was enacted in 1967. Subsurface records do not exist if the structure was constructed prior to 1967.

From 1967 to 1971, state records mainly consist of those septic systems installed within 1000 feet of a surface water. The catalog of these records is not always complete.

From 1967 to 1986, state records consist only of paper records. No electronic records for this time frame exist. The municipality where the structure is located may have either paper or electronic records for these building lots.

From 1986 to present, state records consist of paper and some portion of the records which are electronic. These electronic records can be found on the Subsurface Systems Bureau Public website (above).

Many of our paper records are not at the NH DES offices, but are stored at the NH Bureau of Archives and must be ordered by NH DES. The NHBOA delivers files to NH DES several times per week. The public cannot order records directly.
