Filing deadline for self-employed and their spouse is June15th, any tax owing must be paid by April 30th. You may estimate your balance due for April 30th and settle any remaining balance after filing on June 15th

Important Dates to Remember

Tax filing deadline is April 30th

Self-employed deadline to file is June 15th

Tax owing is due by April 30th for individuals and self-employed

T2200 – Declaration of Conditions of Employment

Form T2200 is provided to employees by their employer. This form allows employees to deduct expenses incurred to do their job. However, expenses that were reimbursed cannot be deducted.

Disability Tax Credit (DTC) – T2201

You may be eligible for the Disability Tax Credit.

The DTC amount is a non-refundable tax credit used to reduce your income tax payable on your income tax return. If you do not need the DTC to reduce your income tax payable, the credit can be transferred to a spouse or common-law partner or someone else.

You may be entitled to refunds, going back 10 years. Ask us for details.

Can someone else sign my income tax return?

If you want someone such as your spouse, common-law partner, a family member, or a friend to sign your tax return, you must have authorized this person to be your legal representative.
