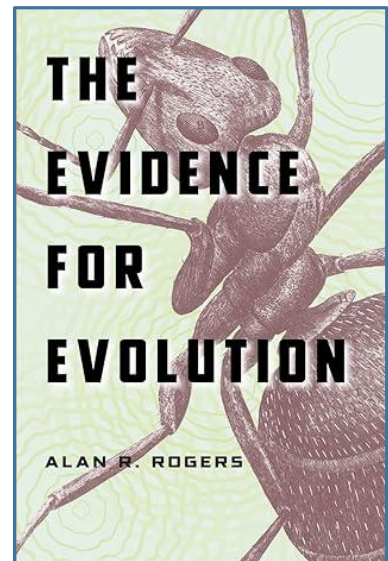


One hundred years ago this July, a Tennessee teacher was convicted for teaching Darwin's theory of evolution in a moment that profoundly shaped science education for decades. The landmark Scopes (Monkey) Trial, famously dramatized in the classic film *Inherit the Wind*, challenged the boundaries between science and belief, law and learning.

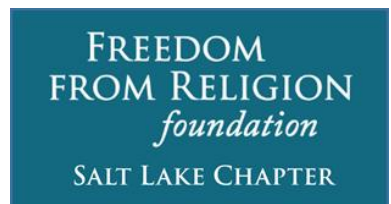


Whether you're a science enthusiast, educator, or simply curious about one of the most pivotal moments in American history, this presentation should be informative and thought provoking.
