The Spot is finally re-opening ~ Saturday, September 5th from 10am-4pm!

After a few more setbacks (our dog spraining his ankle, my husband injuring his arm, and delays waiting on shelving parts), we're finally ready to reopen over Labor Day weekend! If parts arrive early, we may do a soft opening before then. We've had to visit several stores to track down the shelving components, which has taken extra time, but the great news is we now have a firm reopening date.

We're planning to reopen in September because it will take time to set up the store fully. You may have already noticed us moving things into the space; that doesn't mean we're ready yet, but it does mean progress is being made. Shelving has been our biggest challenge, and we've been working late hours to get everything installed as quickly as possible.

This month, we'll be contacting vendors and consignors to schedule setup times. Please note there will be **limited space** compared with our previous location, so we won't be able to accept everything we've taken in before. Before bringing items in, **call, message us on social media, or use our website** to confirm we have room; you may be turned away if space is unavailable. Things will look and feel different due to the smaller footprint, so thank you in advance for your patience and understanding.

We can't wait for you to see the finished store!

Our little shop in town has been a labor of love from the start, and this remodel has been no different. We quickly learned that relying on others isn't always easy due to schedules slip, people don't always show up, and some materials are simply hard to find. That meant we rolled up our sleeves and took on much of the work ourselves, learning new skills and solving problems as they came. It's been challenging, but those challenges have made every small victory feel that much sweeter.

Because of those setbacks and supply delays, reopening has taken a bit longer than we first hoped, but we're keeping the mood upbeat. The extra time has allowed us to be thoughtful about every detail, from layout to lighting, so the finished space will be more comfortable and functional for customers and vendors alike. We've also been careful to coordinate with the few professionals we could count on (electricians, carpet installers, roofing, our contractor, and plumbers) so the big technical pieces are done right. Their expertise, combined with our hands-on work, is shaping a store that's safe, attractive, and built to last.

One of the biggest changes is that this is our new location that we now own instead of rent, which makes the effort feel even more meaningful. Owning the space means we can invest in improvements that reflect our vision and the town's character, rather than temporary fixes. It also means the payoff will be long-term: a place we can grow into, host events in, and pass on with pride. Taking the time to do it properly now will save headaches later and create a stronger foundation for the future.

We're grateful to the handful of people who stuck with us through inspections and tricky installations, and to the town inspectors who helped guide us to code compliance. We know the reopening may not be as fast as some hoped, but we promise it will be worth the wait. When the doors open, it will be a true community-built space; part DIY grit, part professional polish, and a reflection of what a small town can accomplish when folks pitch in. Thank you for your patience and support; we can't wait to welcome you back.
