1. Funding Shortfalls:

- Reduced Donations: Economic uncertainty led to a decrease in donations from individuals and corporations, which NWA heavily rely on for funding.
- Grant Reductions: Foundations and governmental bodies reallocated funds to address immediate pandemic-related needs, reducing the availability of grants for other projects.

2. Operational Disruptions:

Remote Work Adaptation: NWA had to transition to remote work, which posed difficulties due
to limited digital infrastructure and varying levels of technological literacy among staff.

3. Volunteer Engagement:

• Safety Concerns: Ensuring the safety of volunteers was challenging, leading to a reduction in volunteer participation and difficulty in mobilizing on-ground support.

4. Supply Chain Issues:

 Procurement Challenges: Acquiring essential supplies, including personal protective equipment (PPE) and medical supplies, was difficult due to high global demand and disrupted supply chains.

5. Mental Health and Wellbeing:

- Staff Wellbeing: The increased workload, health risks, and emotional strain of the pandemic took a toll on the mental health and wellbeing of NGO staff and volunteers.
- Burnout: Prolonged crisis response efforts led to burnout among employees, affecting their productivity and commitment.
