quality healthcare services. We manage surgical wards at Civil Hospital Karachi Sindh. Our

operations are sustained through funding from the Sindh government and private donors. In the

financial year 2021, our goal was to raise 210 million rupees through zakat and donations.

3. Public Trust and Vaccine Awareness:

NWA played a critical role in building public trust and encouraging vaccination. We worked closely with community leaders and religious figures to disseminate accurate information about vaccines, counter misinformation, and ensure that vaccination efforts were culturally sensitive and aligned with Ramadan practices.

Challenges Faced:

1. Restricted Movement:

Lockdowns and movement restrictions significantly hampered NWA's ability to deliver aid. The inability to travel freely affected the timeliness and efficiency of aid delivery.

2. Resource Constraints:

The surge in demand for aid stretched our resources. The pandemic-induced economic downturn led to reduced donations and funding, making it challenging to sustain large-scale operations over extended periods.

3. Economic Challenges:

• Funding Shortages:

Economic instability during the pandemic led to reduced donations and funding, affecting our capacity to deliver aid and sustain operations. The increased demand for services, coupled with decreased funds, created significant financial strain.

4. Coordination with Government Bodies:

Efficient collaboration with government agencies was essential but often challenging. Misalignments in priorities and strategies between NGOs and governmental bodies led to delays and inefficiencies in aid distribution.

Plans for NWA During and Post-COVID-19:

1. Enhanced Collaboration and Partnerships:

NWA aims to strengthen partnerships with governments, international organizations, and other NGOs. This includes forming coalitions to leverage collective resources and expertise for rapid response and resource distribution.

2. Digital Transformation:

The pandemic accelerated the adoption of digital tools for communication, fundraising, and service delivery. NWA plans to invest in digital infrastructure to improve outreach and operational efficiency, ensuring quick adaptation to disruptions.

3. Focus on Health and Pandemic Preparedness:

NWA will increase focus on health initiatives, including pandemic preparedness and response. This involves strengthening health systems, improving healthcare access, and supporting vaccination campaigns.

4. Community Engagement and Capacity Building:

Empowering local communities to be more self-reliant and resilient is a priority. NWA plans to invest in capacity-building programs that enhance community skills and resources, enabling better emergency handling and sustainable development efforts.
