Moses' Parental Instructions In Deuteronomy 11 Sunday AM 03/18/18

Introduction:

Normally when we think of Moses' instructions to parents we think of *Deut. 6.4-9*. However, *Deuteronomy 11* gives a lot of practical advice for parents as well. Deut- two singers. Dual tires mean there are two tires. Deuteronomy is the second telling of the Law.

I) Parents Know What Your Children Do Not Know, v. 1-7

A) Israel was a young nation with a lot of young people.

- 1. Rebellion at Kadesh Barnea in *Deuteronomy 1* caused Israel to wander in the wilderness for 40 years.
- 2. Everyone twenty years and older would die in the wilderness, *Numbers* 14.29, 34-35.
- 3. Therefore, those present in *Deuteronomy 11* were 60 years old or younger.
 - a. Those twenty at Kadesh Barnea were 60 years old
 - b. Those younger than 20 at Kadesh Barnea would be somewhere between 40 to 60 yrs. old.
 - c. The rest, 40 and under, would have been born in the wilderness.
- 4. The younger generation did not know slavery in Egypt, the plagues, parting of the Red Sea.
- 5. They grew up eating manna and wandering in the wilderness.
- 6. Thus the need for instruction.

B) As parents we might assume some things about our children.

- 1. We might be good at teaching the first child, then teach the second to a less degree, and then grow tired of the teaching and not teach the next one.

 Judges 2.10
- 2. Look at the trends in church history, what was taught and what was neglected.
 - Restoration period cast off creedbooks, one church, means of entrance into that church.
 Lots of baptisms but they neglected to teach the worship of the church and its organization.
 - b. The next generation created missionary societies and instrumental music.
 - c. The following generation learned more about the worship and organization of the church but left the door open for Premillennialism.
 - d. Then subsequent generation was taught a lot about the nature of the Kingdom and its establishment.
 - e. Then came along the social gospel, sponsoring churches, orphan home issue, colleges in the budget. There was a split on those issues. So every preacher taught about the organization of the church, who the church can help, etc.
 - f. But there was not a lot of teaching on the home. So many homes had problems and children were lost to the world.

- g. Then in the 1980's and 1990's a lot of teaching on the home but not a lot about other issues.
- 3. My point is every generation needs to be taught the whole counsel of God.

II) Changes In Environment Requires We Change, v. 8-12

- A) Not all change is bad (keep in mind I am not talking about changing the word of God and neither was Moses).
 - 1. In Egypt they were slaves, the means of farming was irrigation. Even today most of the people on Egypt live close to the Nile River.
 - 2. Now they would receive rain, *v.* 11-12
 - 3. This was tied in with the blessings of being faithful to God.

B) Today change can be good.

- 1. Some churches used to reject "black boards" because they were new. Then came along overhead projectors, now LCD projectors and power point.
- 2. Bulletins used to be typed and then run off on a mimeograph machine. Now we have word processors and better-quality copiers.
- 3. Used to be a lot of teaching was house to house now a lot more is being done on web pages and other internet devices.
- 4. Used to be a lot of young people did not get an education and now just about everybody does. Our young people have a lot advantages because of some of the

III) Young People Need To Be Taught and Others Reminded Departing From God's Word Will Bring About Bad Things, v. 16-27

- A) We know what happened to Israel (we have that advantage)
 - 1. They did not drive out the other nations.
 - 2. They inter-married with the people of the land.
 - 3. Started worshipping their gods.
 - 4. Human sacrifices, immoral behavior, oppressed the poor, took bribes, etc.
 - 5. Finally, they were exiled by God.
- B) Young people need to be taught God's word will bring about blessings and departing from it will bring about suffering.
 - 1. Keep God's word in your home. Be the husband/wife described in *Ephesians 5*.
 - a. Train young children in God's word, *Ephesians* 6.4.
 - b. Children honor your parents, not because they are perfect but because God says so, *Ephesians 6.3*.
 - 2. Worship God in the way prescribed in the Bible. Don't add to or take away from God's word, *Revelation* 22.18-19.
 - 3. Obey the Gospel and do not go back into the world.
