Introduction:

Marriage is the product of love. Those who say they don't need a piece of paper to prove their love have missed the point. A man that will not marry a woman either does not love the woman or is afraid of commitment. Marriage is a product of the love between those involved.

I) THE INVITATION

- A) God reaches out to mankind.
 - 1. Some religions requires mankind to discover or find God.
 - a. Man must act so as to become God.
 - b. Often because they are not God centered but man centered they require man to invent God.
 - 2. In the Bible we see God sent Jesus to this world to die for us, *Titus 2.11-15*.
 - a. Man made in image of God, *Genesis 1.26-27*.
 - b. Through sin man is separated from God, through Christ man is reconciled to God, *2 Corinthians 5.21*.
 - 3. Through baptism we enter into Christ, *Galatians* 3.26-27.

II) AT THE WEDDING THERE IS THE BEST MAN

- A) *John 3.27-28, 29-30* John is the friend or the best man.
 - 1. John prepared the way by preaching.

- a. He was chosen by God as a forerunner to Christ.
- b. Repentance being married requires a change.
- 2. We must be ready and willing to change, *Luke 3.3*.
 - a. Repentance must be before baptism.
- 3. What if you never repent? No change of heart, no change of relationship.
 - a. Can there be an unborn Christian? No!
- 4. Different people have different things to repent of.
- B) A descriptive account of change in *Luke 3.4-6*.
 - 1. This requires the love to see one's faults and want to change.
 - 2. A compliant attitude, comply with God's word.
- C) Repentance is a qualifier. Anyone knows why this wedding should not take place.

III) WEDDING SONG

- A) Statement of love and faithfulness.
 - 1. *2 Timothy 2.11-13* historically used in the first century.
 - 2. To remain faithful, to build a life together, until death, *Revelation 2.10b*.

IV) THE BRIDE AND HER GROOM

A) A voluntary act of expressing one's love for Christ. Every bride is beautiful to every groom. The church, Christians are beautiful to Christ.

B) The Wedding Gown. *Isaiah 61.10* a before and after picture, *Isaiah 64.6*.

V) THE WITNESSES

- A) Some weddings are private and have one or two witnesses. *Acts* 16.33.
- B) Some are public, before a large audience, *Acts 2.38-41*
 - 1. Does the audience good, encourages them and you.
 - 2. Provides a teaching example.
 - a. Recent case of a young woman who finally obeyed the gospel. One hindrance was that she had never seen a baptism.
 - 3. At the same time some are baptized before or after services or during the middle of the week.

VI) THE EXCHANGE OF VOWS

- A) The promise to live together as husband and wife, 1

 Peter 3.21.
 - 1. As one flesh, a commitment to God, *1 Timothy 6.12*.
 - 2. Faithfully, to obey all of God's commandments. *1 John 5.2-3*.
 - 3. To face the good and bad times together.

VII) RINGS GIVEN AS A TOKEN OR SEAL

- A) The Holy Spirit is given to the Christian as a seal, *Ephesians 1.13-14*.
- B) Rings were given to identify as one's possession.1

 Corinthians 1.21-22.

1. We belong to Christ and promises to never forsake us as long as we are faithful.

VIII) TO DECLARE HUSBAND AND WIFE

- A) Matthew 28.18-20
 - 1. By the authority of.
 - 2. To specifically state what has happened.
 - a. Not a baptismal formula.
- B) Wear the name of Christ, *Isaiah 62.2, Acts 11.26*.

Conclusion:

A long and happy life together. The analogy breaks down in that marriage here is to death, our marriage to Christ is to eternity, *Ephesians 5.26-27*.
