Parable Of The Treasure In The Field Sunday PM 05/20/18

Introduction:

Matthew 13.44 is a very short parable. We must make sure to not miss the point of any of Jesus' teaching. Some in looking at a parable may over analysis it. For instance, Luke 16 is not teaching us about honesty but the shrewdness of the unjust steward; Luke 18 the parable of the unjust judge is not a lesson on kindness. In our parable a man finds a "treasure in another man's field". He goes out and mortgages himself to the max in order to purchase the field and get the treasure. Not a lesson on neighborliness but on the value of the Gospel.

I) Acquire the Field Quickly

- A) How many times do we find something of such great value that we immediately go out and liquidate our assets in order to get it?
 - 1. How often have you had a possible business deal and miss the opportunity because you wanted to "think" about it?
 - 2. Perhaps you have done this with a land deal, house, car, or even some yard sale item.

B) Time has a real cost

- 1. Opportunity is limited by time, *Galatians 6.10*.
- 2. Notice in the Book of Acts the response of those who obeyed the Gospel.

- a. Acts 2.38-41 those people did not delay their response to the Gospel.
- b. The response to the second Gospel sermon in *Acts 3-4* is recorded in *verse 4*.
- c. The Philippians jailer was baptized in the same hour of the night, *Acts* 16.33
- 3. Delay is very dangerous due to the temporary nature of life, *2 Corinthians* 6.2.

II) Acquire the Field Joyfully

- A) He concentrates on the value of his treasure.
 - How often do we focus on the cost and not the benefit of something? A car, a house, a family, etc.
 - 2. How often do we think the thing acquired was worth every penny it cost us?
- B) Receiving the Gospel does have a cost but we should receive it with joy.
 - 1. The salvation of your soul is something to be joyful over.
 - 2. The Ethiopian Eunuch went on his way rejoicing. *Acts 8.39*.
 - 3. There is joy in heaven when every one lost soul is saved, *Luke 15.7*.

III) Acquire the Field Permanently

A) This man wanted to acquire all of the treasure and not just a part of it.

- He could have stuffed some the treasure in his pocket and went home. Such would have been a missed opportunity for much more.
- 2. There is a difference in having something temporarily and having it permanently.

B) The Kingdom of heaven is something we should not just want to know about but to receive.

- Unfortunately many receive the Gospel and are faithful for a while. The parable of the Sower wants us about the cares and riches of this world.
- 2. How many give up their treasure and miss out on heaven?
- 3. Just about every church building would be full it all of those who at one time were faithful members were still faithful members.
- Will you sell your soul for something temporary?
 Many will the passing pleasures of sin, *Hebrews* 11.25. For family members? *Matthew* 10.37. For wealth? *Matthew* 19.22-24

Conclusion:

2 Peter 1.10 makes this point for us.
