Current Events: Supreme Court Ruling on Baker and Homosexual Weddings

The general principles on which the fathers achieved independence were the general principles of Christianity. "I will avow that I then believed, and now believe, that those general principles of Christianity are as eternal and immutable as the existence and attributes of God."1—John Adams

"The name of the Lord (says the Scripture) is a strong tower; thither the righteous flee and are safe [Proverbs 18:10]. Let us secure His favor and He will lead us through the journey of this life and at length receive us to a better."10 – Samuel Adams

"The great, vital, and conservative element in our system is the belief of our people in the pure doctrines and the divine truths of the Gospel of Jesus Christ."2—Congress 1854

"Had the people, during the Revolution, had a suspicion of any attempt to war against Christianity, that Revolution would have been strangled in its cradle... In this age, there can be no substitute for Christianity... That was the religion of the founders of the republic and they expected it to remain the religion of their descendants."25—Congress, House Judiciary Committee, 1854

"I am a real Christian – that is to say, a disciple of the doctrines of Jesus Christ".66 – Thomas Jefferson

"I now make it my earnest prayer that God would... most graciously be pleased to dispose us all to do justice, to love mercy, and to demean ourselves with that charity, humility, and pacific temper of the mind which were the characteristics of the Divine Author of our blessed religion."124 – George Washington

I could have easily filled pages upon pages of quotes others who were responsible for the establishment of this country and its laws. However, our nation has turned away from the Bible in many ways. The conflict it now faces is how can it accept its History and claim to still be following the principles of its Founders. This reminds me of Proverbs 26.7a "The legs of the lame are not equal."

This past week the Supreme Court ruled in a case involving a baker in Colorado. This man was sued because he refused to bake a wedding cake for a homosexual wedding. His religious conviction, a conviction based upon the word of God, is marriage involves a man a woman. Since marriage as created by God does not involved two people of the same sex, this man could not in all good conscience bake the cake.

The conflict is not with the word of God, as it defines marriage between a man and a woman, see Genesis 2.24, Matthew 19.4-5. But the quandary is our Supreme Court threw out that definition and the Bible when it ruled a marriage can be between two people of the same sex.
