Introduction:

There are different works in the Bible. Some are condemned, and some are praised. So, I thought a lesson on "work" would be good. However, this created a slight problem as the word" work" is issued a number of different ways. Is it a verb, a noun, an adjective? The answer is yes and more.

I) <u>Defining work</u>

- A) A verb- without an object, to do work, labor
 - 1. To be employed.
 - 2. He hasn't work for six weeks.
- B) A verb with an object to use or manage (an apparatus).
 - 1. She can work many power tools.
 - 2. Work clothes.
- C) A noun- exertion or effort directed to produce or accomplish something; labor.
 - 1. I have been working on this house for weeks.
 - 2. One's place of employment.
- D) Adjective of, for, or concerning work
 - 1. Work clothes.

The point being work sometimes refers to what one does, the product of one's work, the place one works, or the object one is working on.

II) <u>Dead works, Hebrews 6.1</u>

A) Works under the law of Moses, *Hebrews 9.13-14.*

- The works under the law of Moses convicted and condemned one of sin, leading to death.
- The law of Moses was taken out of the way, it became a dead law, supplanted by the Law of Christ. In this case it separated the one keeping the Old Law from the New Law.

B) Work of the devil, John 8.44

- 1. Specific works we attribute to the devil.
- 2. Tempted Adam and Eve, *Genesis 3*.
- 3, Tempted Jesus, called the tempter, *Matthew 4.3*

C) Works of the flesh, *Galatians 5.19ff*.

- 1. They gratify the flesh but cause great harm.
- 2. Great harm to the one performing those works, great harm to those affected by those deeds.

D) Self-righteous works, *Romans 10.3*.

1. There are works that appear to be righteous but have nothing to do with God's word. *Colossians* 2.20-23

2. We should never equate these self-righteous works with our next work.

III) Good works in the Bible.

A) The works of God.

- 1. Creation of the Universe, *Genesis 2.2-3*.
- 2. The flood during the days of Noah.
- 3. Walls of Jericho falling down.
- 4. The birth of Jesus.

B) Works of Christ, John 9.4

- 1. Living a sinless life
- 2. Fulfilling all righteousness, *Matthew 3.14-15*
- 3. Fulfilling all scriptures, *Matthew 5.17*
- 4. Being our perfect example
- 5. Fulfilling all the prophesies concerning Him.

C) Work of faith, 1 Thess. 1.3.

- 1. There are works based on God's word, *Romans* 10.17.
 - Noah built an Ark based solely upon God's word, Hebrews 11.7.
 - b. The children of Israel marching around the city of Jericho was a work of faith.

- 2. There are works we do because of conviction and trust in God. *John* 8.39
- D) Works we are to do under the law or Christ, *Phil.* 2.12-13 (Not going to be works under the law of Moses, work of the devil, work of the flesh, or self-righteous works.
 - 1. We are not passive in our salvation but have these things to do.
 - 2. Have an active faith that moves us to obey God.
 - 3. What are some of these works?
 - a. Believe Jesus is the Son of God, John 8.24
 - b. Works of repentance, *Matthew 3.8*
 - c. Work of baptism, *Colossians 2.11-12*.

Conclusion:

Grace, faith, and works are all part of our salvation. Grace – Jesus leaving heaven to live and die a cruel death. Faith – accepting God's work and believing. Works in obeying God's word.
