- 1. Old English "godspel" glad tidings.
- 2. God meaning good; spel story or message.
- 3. Literally "good spell" or good news.

B) Glad tidings

- 1. *Isaiah 52.7* earlier passages points out that Israel be taken away, they will wail, be taken away of nothing. But God has a proclamation, as stated in *Isaiah 52.7* and that good news will be proclaimed.
- 2. *Romans 10.15* is the New Testament usage as the Gospel being proclaimed is truly good news.
- 3. *Luke 1.19* the angel speaks to Zacharias as a child will be born to him and Elizabeth.

- a. First, good news is they will have a child.
- b. That child will go out and prepare the people for the coming of the Messiah. *Luke 1.17*
- 4. *Luke 8.1* uses the phrase "glad tidings" as they were preaching concerning the kingdom of God.
- C) The death, burial, and resurrection of Christ, 1 *Corinthians 15.1-5, Acts 13.32* (Paul preaching at Antioch of Pisidian)
 - 1. Why is this "good news?"
 - 2. Without a sacrifice for our sins we are lost.
 - 3. God's grace made salvation possible by the blood of Jesus shed on the cross. *John 19.34; Ephesians 1.7*.
 - 4. Jesus' resurrection proves death has no power over him.
 - 5. Each and every person can be saved. *Acts 2.21*.
 - 6. The vilest of sinners can be forgiven, Paul called himself the chief of sinners, *1 Timothy 1.15*.
- D) The Gospels -Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John gives us the birth, teachings, miracles, and facts about Jesus' life.
- II) More Good News

A) You are not alone

- 1. There are many Christians in the world. All bound by the same fellowship with God and His saints.
- 2. The promise made to the Apostles in *Matthew* 28.19-20 is stated in 2 *Timothy* 2.19.
- 3. Where two or three are gathered together in His name, He, Jesus, is with us, *Matthew 18.20*.
- B) You can do all things through Christ who strengthens you, *Phil. 4.13*
 - This does not mean you become Superman, able to heap tall buildings, or stop a speeding bulletin or train.
 - It does mean you can rely on Him to give you strength to overcome temptations, 1 Corinthians 10.13
 - 3. It means you can overcome the wiles of the devil. *Ephesians 6.11*.
- C) God wants you to pray and listens to your prayers, *1 Peter 3.12*
 - 1. We should never minimize the importance and power of prayer.
 - 2. If you had the opportunity to talk to the most powerful person in the world, would you do it?

- 3. We have a God who encourages us to pray to Him, *Luke 18.1*.
- 4. James states it this way, *James 5.16*.
- D) There is a better place for the faithful, 2Timothy 4.8
 - 1. The sufferings of this world is nothing compared to the joy of heaven. *Revelation 2.10*
 - 2. Our love ones who have gone on before would never want to come back to his world, their desire is for us to come and be with them.
