#### Introduction:

The person Abel is mentioned about six times in the Bible, yet when a person speaks about "Abel," we know who they are talking about. Abel was a man of deep conviction (*Genesis 4.1-8; Hebrews 11.4*). Conviction is a) the act or process of convincing, b) the state of being convinced, c) a fixed or strong belief. So what made Abel worthy of our study. Because of his faith.

## I) He Had Saving Faith

- A) What is "saving faith" this is often misunderstood today?
- B) Abel was told by God what to do and then did it, *Romans* 10.17.
  - 1. He is called righteous Abel in *Matthew 23.33-35*.
  - 2. God said Abel was righteous, *Hebrews 11.4*.
- C) A lot of time has been devoted to understanding why Abel's sacrifice was accepted and Cain's was not.
  - 1. We see their sacrifices were different and so was their attitude.
  - 2. Cain was warned by God in *Genesis 4.7*.
  - 3. Later on we read of Cain's deeds being evil, 1

#### John 3.11-13.

- D) In contrast to Abel, Cain refused to exercise "saving faith".
  - 1. His works were evil, 1 John 3.11-13
  - 2. He was rejected by God, *Genesis 4.4-5*
  - 3. His religion was false, *Jude 1.8-11*
  - 4. He had "will worship".

## II) Abel's Faith Led Him to Sacrifice

- A) He brought the very best he had to the altar, *Genesis 4.4*.
  - A sacrifice by definition means there is a real cost in what we are doing.
    - a. Think of the example of David, 2 Samuel 24.24.
    - b. As opposed to the sacrifice of King Saul in 1 Samuel 15.19-23.
  - 2. God told the children of Israel which sacrifices would be accepted and which would be rejected. Lev. 22.17-22; Mal. 1.6-8
  - 3. Today Christians are priest and we offer sacrifices to God.
    - a. "Spiritual sacrifices" 1 Peter 2.5.

- b. "Living sacrifice" *Romans* 12.1-2.
- c. The fruit of our lips, *Hebrews 13.15*.

#### III) Abel's Faith Caused Him to Suffer

- A) In Abel was have the first recorded worship and murder.
  - Would Abel had offered such a sacrifice is he knew it would cost him, his life?
  - 2. It takes a person of integrity to believe God and knowing his faith may cause him to suffer, *Luke* 8.15.
- B) It cost something to live by faith- Abel paid the price.
  - 1. Such has always been the case, Luke 11.47- 49
  - 2. Christ left us an example to follow, 1 Peter 2.21-24.
  - 3. Those who live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution, *2 Timothy 3.12*.
  - 4. We will be in good company, *Matthew 5.10-12*.
  - 5. Be faithful until death is no just a slogan, Revelation 2.10

## IV) His Faith still Speaks

## A) He being dead still speaks, *Hebrews 11.4*

- 1. Not one word from Abel is in the Bible. Yet we talk about his great sacrifice and faith.
- 2. The deeds of the righteous will follow them, *Rev.* 14.13.

# B) When we trust God and do what He says we leave a lasting impression on those around us.

- 1. As parents we leave our mark on our children, for better or worse. *2 Timothy 1.5*.
- 2. As a neighbor we leave some type of influence on them (The World's Only Bible).
- 3. To other Christians we leave some kind of example on them.
