- A) Things we had and did without thinking

  - 2. Going to worship, going to work was replaced with working at home or not working.

  - Matthew 6:11 Give us this day our daily bread. Became more relevant as some food was in short supply. Reminded

me some of Tula, Russia back in the 1990's.

# 1 Timothy 6:6 Now godliness with contentment is great gain.

- 2. A re-evaluation of what is and is not important. Health of family members took on increased importance.
- 3. Saw generosity as people reached out to help each other.

1 Timothy 6:17 Command those who are rich in this present age not to be haughty, nor to trust in uncertain riches but in the living God, who gives us richly all things to enjoy. 18 Let them do good, that they be rich in good works, ready to give, willing to share, 19 storing up for themselves a good foundation for the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life.

# II) <u>Distance Creates Distance</u>

- A) People tried to stay in contact by various means.
  - 1. Zoom, Google Meets, and other social platforms became useful instruments in reaching out and conducting business.
  - 2. Yet increase in suicides as isolation increased. Human contact and face to face is important.
- B) Lesson from those who did not settle in Canaan.
  - 1. **Numbers 32** Gad, Rueben and half tribe of Manasseh asked on remain on the eastern side of the Jordan River.
    - a. Moses pointed out their obligation to their brethren to go and fight in Canaan.

Numbers 32:6 And Moses said to the children of Gad and to the children of Reuben: "Shall your

## brethren go to war while you sit here?

b. They agreed to go and fight with their brethren.

Numbers 32:25 And the children of Gad and the children of Reuben spoke to Moses, saying: "Your servants will do as my lord commands. 26 "Our little ones, our wives, our flocks, and all our livestock will be there in the cities of Gilead; 27 "but your servants will cross over, every man armed for war, before the LORD to battle, just as my lord says."

2. They receive the land.

Joshua 22:7 Now to half the tribe of Manasseh Moses had given a possession in Bashan, but to the other half of it Joshua gave a possession among their brethren on this side of the Jordan, westward. And indeed, when Joshua sent them away to their tents, he blessed them, 8 and spoke to them, saying, "Return with much riches to your tents, with very much livestock, with silver, with gold, with bronze, with iron, and with very much clothing. Divide the spoil of your enemies with your brethren." 9 So the children of Reuben, the children of Gad, and half the tribe of Manasseh returned, and departed from the children of Israel at Shiloh, which is in the land of Canaan, to go to the country of Gilead, to the land of their possession, which they had obtained according to the word of the LORD by the hand of Moses.

3. But they also saw the danger of being separated from those on the western side of the Jordan River.

- a. They built an altar which created a stir among the other tribes.
- b. The explanation is noteworthy.

Joshua 22:24 "But in fact we have done it for fear, for a reason, saying, 'In time to come your descendants may speak to our descendants, saying, "What have you to do with the LORD God of Israel? 25 "For the LORD has made the Jordan a border between you and us, you children of Reuben and children of Gad. You have no part in the LORD." So your descendants would make our descendants cease fearing the LORD.'

- 4. Sayings like "Absence makes the heart grow fonder" is not necessarily true. Absence can make us forget one another.
- 5. Afraid the church is going to suffer for a long time due to the shut downs.

# III) There is Nothing New Under the Sun

A) The experiences of a generation may be new to that particular generation.

Ecclesiastes 1:9 That which has been is what will be, That which is done is what will be done, And there is nothing new under the sun. 10 Is there anything of which it may be said, "See, this is new"? It has already been in ancient times before us. 11 There is no remembrance of former things, Nor will there be any remembrance of things that are to come By those who will come after.

1. My generation had not had a pandemic before but there have been previous "pandemics"

- a. The bubonic plague of 541-542 killed 10% of the world's population
- b. The black plague 1346-1353 some estimate half of Europe's population died.
- c. Spanish flu 1918-1920 estimated 500 million died
- 2. Economic hard times, food shortages, riots, have all happened before.

## B) Can give us comfort and hope

1 Corinthians 10:13 No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.

- 1. Whatever trials you have to endure, others have done so.
- 2. Others have suffered in time to need, faced persecution, health issues, etc.
- 3. The key is to remain faithful in times of trials.

James 1:2 My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, 3 knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. 4 But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.

4. Think of those in *Hebrews 11* and what they endured in service to God.

Hebrews 12:3 For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become

weary and discouraged in your souls. 4 You have not yet resisted to bloodshed, striving against sin.

And great was its fall."
