Exodus And Christ

Introduction:

Genesis ends with the death of Joseph. Exodus continues the history of Jacob's family, 215 years later.

I) Exodus 1

- A) Genesis 47.27 ends with the family of Israel in the land of Goshen tending to their herds.
 - 1. They were prospering and separated from the Egyptians, *Exodus 1.7* some estimated Israel to have been well over a million people by this time.
 - 2. In the mean time a new Pharaoh came into power, one that did not know Joseph or his family. *Exodus 1.8*
 - 3. Acts 7.17-19 some believe Egypt was over taken by outsiders hence a change in the government.

B) Israel afflicted

- 1. The Egyptians were afraid of them, vv. 9.10
- 2. Israelites were in bondage, v. 11
- 3. Pharaoh ordered the death of the Hebrew male babies, *v.* 22

II) Exodus 2

A) Moses first 40 years

- 1. Moses mother hid him for three months and then placed him in an ark and set his adrift on the river, vv. 2.3
- 2. Pharaoh's daughter hired his mother to nurse the child and rear him, *v.* 9
- 3. Pharaoh's daughter found the baby and named him Moses, *v.* 10

B) Moses second 40 years

- Moses brought up in Pharaoh's household until he killed a slave master, Acts 7.23-30
- 2. Goes to land of Midian and become a shepherd, marries Zipporah, and has children.

III) <u>Exodus 3</u> on covers the beginning of the last forty years of Moses' life

A) God speaks to Moses on Mount Sinai, *Chapter 3*

- 1. God heard the cries and prayers of Israel, v. 7
- 2. Moses to go back to bring Israel out of Egypt
- 3. God identifies himself, vv. 14-16

B) Chapters – 12 Moses in Egypt

- 1. Ten Plagues
 - a. Water turned into blood, 7.14ff
 - b. Frogs 8.1-5
 - c. Lice *8.16-19*

- d. Flies 8.20-32
- e. Livestock Diseased 9.1-7
- f. Boils -9.8-12
- g. Hail 9.13-35
- h. Locust 10.1-20
- i. Darkness 10. 21-29
- j. Death of the firstborn -11.1 12.30
- 2. Each plague was to prove the existence and power of God
- 3. Each plague would have brought economic hardships and suffering on the Egyptians.
- 4. Nine times Pharaoh hardened his heart to not obey God.
- 5. The 10th plague caused Pharaoh to let Israel go.

C) Israel leaves Egypt, 12.31

- Parting of the Red Sea and destruction of Egypt's army, 14.1-15
- 2. Mount Sinai and the giving of the Law, 19.1ff (v.8)

D) End of the Patriarchal Dispensation and the Beginning of the Mosaic

1. Exodus 20 - the 10 Commandments

- 2. Moses on Mount Sinai for 40 days, *Ex. 24.9-10*, (vv. 7-8)
- 3. Israel worships the Golden calf, *Ex. 32*

E) Exodus 35ff

- 1. The making of the Tabernacle, establishment of the High Priest and the priesthood, offerings, etc.
- 2. God enters the Tabernacle, *Exodus 40.34-38*

IV) Christ In Exodus

A) Type and Anti-type (Moses and Christ)

- Moses sent by God to deliver Israel from bondage in Egypt – Christ sent by God to deliver mankind for the bondage of sin, *Romans* 6.21-23
- 2. Moses a prophet Christ the prophet, *John 6.14*
- 3. Moses interceded for Israel Christ lives to intercede for us, *Hebrews 7.25*
- 4. Moses a servant was faithful Jesus the Son was faithful, *Hebrews 3.2-3*

B. The Passover and The Lord's Supper

- Passover lamb was to be a male lamb, one year old, and without blemish Jesus is our Passover lamb (*John 1.29*) without blemish (sin)
- 2. Not a bone was to be broken Not a bone of Jesus was broken, *John 19.36*
- 3. Unleavened bread for Israel had to leave in a

- hurry unleavened bread which is the body of Christ, *Matthew 26.26*
- 4. Fruit of the vine is the blood of Christ, the blood of the New Covenant, *Matthew* 26.28

C) The Tabernacle and the church

- 1. Dwelling place of God the church is the dwelling place of God, *1 Corinthians 6.19*
- D) Law of Moses ratified and the people sprinkled with the blood of animals The Law of Christ ratified with the blood of Christ and we are washed in His blood, *Eph. 1.7*

Conclusion:

God did not forget His promises to Abraham. In Exodus Israel starts to become a nation, move toward Canaan, and God's special people. In Christ we are God's holy and special people.
