## God in Isaiah Sunday PM (invitation) 07/31/22

It may be no other Old Testament Prophet gives us a more comprehensive description of God than Isaiah.

- I) God Is Not...
  - A) Like any other "god" Isaiah 44:6b "Besides Me there is no God."
  - B) Not an image, an idol, Isaiah shows us the foolishness of idolatry – Isaiah 44.9ff, 16-17 He burns half of it in the fire; With this half he eats meat; He roasts a roast, and is satisfied. He even warms himself and says, "Ah! I am warm, I have seen the fire." 17 And the rest of it he makes into a god, His carved image. He falls down before it and worships it, Prays to it and says, "Deliver me, for you are my god!"
- II) God is..
  - A) Creator Isaiah 40:28 Have you not known? Have you not heard? The everlasting God, the LORD, The Creator of the ends of the earth, Neither faints nor is weary. His understanding is unsearchable.
  - B) The one who called out Israel (Jacob) *Isaiah 43:1a* But now, thus says the LORD, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel:
  - C) The redeemer Isaiah 43:1b "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine.
  - D) Sent His Servant to all peoples Isaiah 42:1 "Behold! My Servant whom I uphold, My Elect One in whom My soul delights! I have put My Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the Gentiles... 6 "I, the LORD, have called You in righteousness, And will hold Your hand; I will keep You and give You as a covenant to the people, As a light to the Gentiles,
  - E) The One who will pour out His Spirit Isaiah 44:3 For I will pour water on him who is thirsty, And floods on the dry ground; I will pour My Spirit on your descendants, And My blessing on your offspring;

God is eternal, all powerful, etc. We need to recognize His majesty and authority.
