The Last Week Of Jesus' Life - Mary Anoints Jesus Mark 14.3-9; Matthew 26.6-13; John 12.1-8 Sunday AM 06/23/19

Introduction:

What would you have done if Jesus had come to your house? Prepare the best food, use the best dishes, clean the house, dress in your best clothes, etc.

I) The Setting

- A) Location Simon the leper's house at Bethany, 2 miles from Jerusalem.
- B) Time John records this before Jesus entered Jerusalem on Sunday. Matthew and Mark record this event with the events of the last week.
- C) Those present Mary, Lazarus, perhaps Martha, Jesus and His disciples.
- D) The occasion a common meal.
- E) The events; Jesus and His disciples are reclining around the table
 - Mary takes a pound of ointment (Spikenard) about
 ounces of liquid.
 - 2. Mary anoints Jesus by breaking the box and pouring the oil on Jesus' head (*Mark 14.3*), and feet (*John 12.3*).
 - 3. Immediately some reacted with horror

- a. Why was this oil wasted? *Mark 14.4 .5*
- b. It could have been sold and given to the poor
- c. Judas wanted to steal the money, *John 12.6*
- 4. Jesus refers to His death, this was in essence preparation for His burial
 - a. Did Mary realize His death was near? Probably not.
 - b. However, they had to realize the danger Jesus was in, *Mark 14.1-2; Matthew 26.3-5*

II) Jesus' Statements and The Lesson

- A) She has done a good work for Me, *Mark 14.6*
 - 1. She gave the best she had.
 - O. T. example of giving the best, the first fruits (Ezekiel 20.40), materials for the tabernacle of meeting in Exodus, the temple of God (1 Kings 6-8), 1 Cor. 15.46
 - 3. We are to give our best, *Matthew 22.37-40*
 - 4. Why should we give our best? God has given us His best

B) Me You Do Not Always Have, *Mark 14.7*

- Certain things must be done when the opportunity arises.
- 2. Not all opportunities are or equal value.

3. Some we should not do, some really will not matter, some will be present for a long time, and some will be brief or even once in a lifetime.

C) She Has She Has Done What She Could, Mark 14.8

- Love is often sacrificial and based on what we can do.
- 2. We must be willing to do what we can do, 2 Corinthians 8.3
 - a. Our first fruits are not in competition
 - b. She gave unsparingly, all there was to give, Mark 12.42ff
 - c. Do we give the leftovers or the first fruits?
 - d. Story of the rocks

D) This Woman Will Also Be Spoken of As A Memorial To Her, *Mark 14.9*

- 1. Great people of the Bible Moses, Abraham, Joseph, Noah, Abel, Enoch, etc are noted for their faith.
- 2. God knows those who are His, 2 *Timothy 2.19*
- 3. What we do will be our memorial. What will others say about you? What will Jesus say about you?
