The Last Week Of Jesus' Life - Peter Denies Jesus Sunday PM 10/20/19

Introduction:

Jesus warned the disciples of their upcoming trial, *Matthew* 26.31-35. We want to specifically examine Peter at this time, *Luke* 22.31-32.

I) <u>Jesus Foretold Peter's Denial</u>, <u>John 13.37-38</u>

- A) Peter responds with supreme confidence, *Mark* 14.29-31
 - 1. There is real danger in over confidence, 1

 Corinthians 10.12
 - 2. None of us are above temptation. Families and marriages have ended because people were overly confident.
 - 3. If we don't take the warning seriously we won't take the next verse seriously, *v.* 13.

B) Peter ignored the warning.

- 1. The warning "take heed" is used 55 times in the Bible
- 2. The best warning devices will do no good if we ignore it.

II) Peter is willing to die for Jesus, John 18.10-11

A) Despite the incredible odds Peter is willing to go to battle

1. Jesus stops Peter and even attaches the ear of the servant, *Luke 22.50-51*.

2. From this point on Peter is different

B) Why was Peter willing to die at this time and later on deny Jesus?

- 1. Some people are willing to be crucified with Christ as long as it meets their criteria.
 - a. We are to take up our cross daily, *Matthew* 10.38
 - b. We are to deny ourselves, *Matthew 16.24*
- 2. Some have no problem attending services but do not want to deny themselves of sinful pleasures.
- 3. Some are good to their neighbors but do not want to worship God, etc.
- 4. We can not pick and chose our crosses, *Galatians* 2.20

III) Peter followed Jesus from a distance, Mark 14.53-54

A) Peter could see Jesus, he was inside the High Priest's Palace or house

- 1. Peter was near a fire, this was a court yard area, *John 18.15-16*
- 2. Peter was a spectator and no longer a participant.
- 3. Peter had not totally run away but he was not close either.

B) Many Christians are in the place of Peter

- 1. Just enough religion to be miserable
 - a. Not faithful (*Hebrews 10.25*); not reading their Bibles (*Acts 17.11*); not wearing

modest clothing (1 Timothy 2.8-9); not being an example (Matthew 5.13-16).

- 2. What if every member of this congregation was just you and I?
- 3. Would there be enough salt, enough light to light this building.

IV) Look at Peter's denials

- A) First denial, *Matthew 26.70; Mark 14.68; John 18.17*
- B) Second denial, *Matthew 26.72; Luke 22.57; John 18.25*
- C) Third denial, *Matthew 26.74; Mark 14.71*
- D) Once we start denying Jesus it is difficult to turn around
- V) <u>Jesus knew what Peter had done, Luke 22.61</u>
 - A) Imagine how Peter felt, three times denying Jesus
 - B) God's knows our every move, our strengths and weaknesses and so does Satan.
 - 1. We need to be honest with ourselves about what we can and can not resist.
 - C) If you had to face Jesus today would you be joyful or would you cry?

Conclusion:

Fortunately Peter turned his life around to serve God. How about you?
