# **Two Dates on the Calendar**

#### Introduction:

There are two days on the calendar that I want to focus on - - February 29, 2004 and March 3, 2020.

## I) February 29<sup>th</sup>

## A) Why do we have a February 29<sup>th</sup>?

- 2. For me it was the chance to preach a sermon relating to February 29<sup>th</sup> to something religious.
- 3. My sister in-law, Peggy died on February 25<sup>th</sup> a Wednesday. Instead of preaching I was helping to carry her body to her grave on the 29th.

#### C) Lesson learned, Ps. 118.24

- 1. Special days are not determined by the calendar.
  - a. A man was going thought his wife's things and came upon some clothing his wife had bought eight or 9 years earlier for some special occasion. She never that piece of clothing.
  - b. Some days are special because of some event that occurred on that day, such as Wedding Anniversaries, birthdays, etc
  - c. Some are unexpectedly special.
  - d. Some are special because we make them special.
  - e. You don't know what special thing will happen each day. A number of years ago a young preacher got ready to go to services. He met a young lady. That was a special day.
- 2. Just like the calendar, if we don't make adjustments in our life, we will be off course.
  - a. None of us are sinless, all need the blood of Christ.
  - b. Christians are not perfect, we need God's forgiveness, **1** John **1.9**

## II) <u>March 3, 2020</u>

## A) The tragedy of the tornado hitting Tennessee

- 1. We can see the devastation, loss of property, loss of lives, and sorrow.
- 2. My own reaction: a young couple is missing (that is bad); a

young Christian couple with their child is missing (I wondered who they were); I saw their picture (that could have been one of our children, their spouse, and grandson).

3. That made it really hard for me to deal with.

## C) Instead of questioning God

- 1. Live in God's presence, *Matthew 28.20*
- 2. Remember God's promises, *Phil.* **4.19** (An observation made concerning the television interviews in Cookeville, was God being mentioned in every interview).
- 3. Lean on God's power, *2 Chronicles 32.7-8*
- 4. Look for God's purpose, *James 1.17-18.*

## B) Lesson learned

- 1. The uncertainty and brevity of life. *James 4.13ff*
- 2. Some things we have to leave in the hands of God. 2 Samuel 12.22-23
- 3. The power of sympathizing, *Hebrews 4.15-16*.
  - a. We read various passages of Jesus feeling compassion for others, *John 11.35-36 Mt. 14.14, Mark 6.34*.
  - b. Definition of sympathize –1. to be in sympathy or agreement of feeling; share in a feeling (often followed by with). --2. to feel a compassionate sympathy, as for suffering or trouble (often followed by with). --3. to express sympathy or condole (often followed by with). --4.to be in approving accord, as with a person or cause: to sympathize with a person's

aims. --5. to agree, correspond, or accord.

- c. To put yourself in the place of others.
- 4. Jesus put Himself in our place He understands the pain of betray, the sorrow of losing love ones, the hurt of ridicule, the temptation of temptation, and death.
  - a. We are to take comfort in this and be emboldened with such knowledge.

#### **Conclusion:**

Both dates will never be the same. Those who loss love ones who are in Christ can be comforted by **1** *Thess.* **4.14-18**.
