What The New Year Brings

Introduction:

Here we are at the beginning of another "New Year". Often people try to predict what will happen in the future. Usually, they are wrong as we don't know what unforeseen events will occur. But we can be sure each year will be different while also similar. A song often sung at the New Year is "Auld Lang Syne". Written by a Scottish poet, Robert Burns" in 1788 but not printed until after his death in 1796 it does not actually mention anything about a New Year. It speaks of two old friends who get together and reminisce. In Scottish the first stanza reads like this:

"Auld Lang Syne" are:

Should auld acquaintance be forgot, And never brought to mind? Should auld acquaintance be forgot, And auld lang syne

For auld lang syne, my jo, For auld lang syne. We'll tak a cup o' kindness yet, For auld lang syne.

In English the wording "Auld Lang Syne" means "Old Long Since" or "For Old Times Sake" and reads like this:

Should old acquaintance be forgot And never brought to mind? Should old acquaintance be forgot, And long, long ago.

And for long, long ago, my dear For long, long ago We'll take a cup of kindness yet For long, long ago.

In this lesson we want to not look back so much as look forward to what will be the

same but different. Remembering another saying, 'the more things change, the more they stay the same." Which was written in 1849.

I) <u>Challenges and Trials</u>

- A) Meaning a contest, or competition, especially a duel.
 - 1. They are something to be overcome or at least dealt with.
 - 2. Israel was literally met with a challenge from Goliath.

⁸ Then he stood and cried out to the armies of Israel, and said to them, "Why have you come out to line up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and you the servants of Saul? Choose a man for yourselves, and let him come down to me. ⁹ If he is able to fight with me and kill me, then we will be your servants. But if I prevail against him and kill him, then you shall be our servants and serve us." ¹⁰ And the Philistine said, "I defy the armies of Israel this day; give me a man, that we may fight together." ¹¹ When Saul and all Israel heard these words of the Philistine, they were dismayed and greatly afraid. **1** Samuel **17:8-11**

 - 1. What direction in life will you take this year?

- a. Will you walk a selfish walk thinking only of self and the here and now?
- b. Will you take a worldly path and walk in sin.
- c. Will you walk with God?

C) Older people

II) <u>Opportunities</u>

A) They often come in disguise, such as challenges

- 1. Story of man who tried to get a job at Microsoft but couldn't because he did not have email.
