# $7^{\text {th }}$ ANNUAL COMMUNITY EASTEREGG HUNT <br> Hosted by Glastonbury Newcomers' $\ddagger$ Neighbors' Club 

We are excited for our 7th annual Easter Egg Hunt. To help you prepare for the hunt we wanted to provide you with some information about the three age groups.

## BABY CHICKS (under three)

They will be in a small roped off area. Each child will have a special egg with their name on it to find. This group will go first.

## HOPPERS (four to six)

Their eggs will be located in an open field. Each child will have a special egg with their name on it to find. This group will go second.

## BAD NEWS BUNNIES (seven to $5^{\text {th }}$ Grade)



Seven and older will have an egg challenge that includes running. The final stop includes a golden egg with a sweet treat. Five of those golden eggs will include a golden ticket for a special prize. If needed, a stand-in for the running portion is welcome. This group will go third.

- Age Groups: The group will be divided by age ( 7,8 and $9+$ ).
- Starting Line: Each child will place their basket on the ground at the starting line.
- Finish Line: At the finish line, 6 groupings of eggs will be placed by color (blue, pink, purple, orange, green and white). Each group will be highlighted by colored balloons (i.e., two blue balloons will be located in the center of the blue egg group).
- Staggered Time: Each age group will have a staggered start time since children will be running back and forth from the starting line and the finish line ( 6 times) where their baskets are lined up.
- At the Signal: Each child will run straight towards one color group of eggs in no specific order. Each child will grab TWO eggs of the SAME color and return them back to their basket. Each child will repeat these same steps until they have 10 eggs (i.e., 2 blue, 2 pink, 2 purple, 2 orange and 2 green eggs). Once they collect TWO of each color, the child then runs and collects ONE white egg.
- Prizes: Each child will have a special white egg. Additionally, there will be five golden tickets located in the golden eggs for a chocolate bunny.
