"Hunters of Color exists to facilitate important conversations about race through empathy and active listening, and to ultimately create an outdoors where everyone feels welcome, invited, safe, and equipped for success," said Lydia Parker, Director of Development for HOC. "We believe that 'The Outdoors are for Everyone' and we will continue to challenge stereotypes and break down barriers to entry until hunting demographics reflect this truth," Parker continued.

Through their new partnership, the two organizations will host a virtual turkey calling class for new hunters. Debbie LeGette, of <u>Debbie Outdoors</u>, has graciously agreed to instruct the first class. LeGette has a strong relationship with the National Wild Turkey Federation<sup>™</sup>, serving as the South Carolina State Chairwoman for the Women In The Outdoors<sup>®</sup> program.
