

# ¡Vamos A Pescar!

In February, wildHERness was selected as a recipient for the prestigious George H.W. Bush Vamos A Pescar grant, which awards \$5,000 to encourage family participation in fishing, focusing on urban Hispanic populations. Administered by the Recreational Boating & Fishing Foundation, the grant was created in 2014 when Johnny Morris, CEO & Founder of Bass Pro Shops, donated \$125,000 to support state and local initiatives that engage Hispanic families in fishing, boating & conservation activities.

Partnering with Johnson County Kansas Fishing's Future chapter, we will host a three part series of progressive educational fishing classes. Participants will learn all the skills necessary to become proficient anglers, from knot tying and fish identification to casting techniques and bait selection. At the end of the series, all participants will receive a rod and reel, PFD, annual fishing license, t-shirt, a family tackle box and an annual Kansas State Parks parking pass -- all the tools to create a successful angler! On 03.10.2021, wildHERness partnered with The Kansas Bee Company to present a virtual Beekeeping class. Participants logged in from the comfort of their own homes to learn tips, tricks and interesting facts on raising the world's busiest workers. Did you know bees have five eyes, can fly almost 20 miles per hour and pollinate over 130 agricultural crops in the United States? This class covered bee anatomy, habits and care, hive development and maintenance, honey processing, pollen variations and more. During the hour long zoom course, the attendees watched videos and saw photos of the Kansas Bee Company in action. Over 60 questions were asked during the session and everyone left with a newfound or deepened respect for our favorite fuzzy little farmers. Thank you to Kansas Bee Company for sharing your wealth of knowledge! All proceeds from this class were donated to MO Hives KC, a local non-profit organization dedicated to conserving bees in KC urban areas.

# Community SERVICE



The women of wildHERness believe that creating community is a vital part to becoming a sportswoman. And, nothing bonds humans together more quickly than giving energy to a cause far greater than ourselves. If you've attended an event with us, chances are you have heard one of the founders remark that "we become better conservationists every time we venture out of doors", or something to that extent. But, we vehemently believe that to be true -- so much so that we built an organization founded on service projects and continuing education.

## 2020 Highlights

We assisted with a habitat improvement project on an area intended for use as a dog training and controlled upland bird hunt site. The savannah-type landscape boasted a woody component not typically found in traditional upland bird habitat. So, a ragtag group of women assembled to assist in removing the trees and piling them into windrows.







### Planting for Pollinators

Last October, wildHERness partnered with the Kansas Department of Wildlife & Johnson County Pheasants Forever to host a service project benefitting pollinators. Nearly 50 Scouts and local volunteers came together to learn more about native plant species that are important food sources for various types of pollinator species. A variety of native seeds were collected and dispersed over an area at Prairie Center in Olathe, KS. We plan to continue seasonal planting events at this location to develop a year-round source of food for visiting insect species.
