Note: Have everyone guess and then turn to the verses below.

- We suffer bodily: Acts 9:33-34, "There he found a man named Aeneas, who was paralyzed and had been bedridden for eight years.
- We suffer in our souls: 1 Samuel 1:10-15, (V15) No, my lord," Hannah replied. "I am a woman oppressed in spirit. I have not had any wine or strong drink, but I have poured out my soul before the LORD.
- We suffer in our spirit: Job 17:1, "My spirit is broken, my days are extinguished, the grave is ready for me.

		• We suffer emotions : Proverbs 15:13, "A glad neart makes a cheerful face, but by sorrow of heart the spirit is crushed."

		Question: Can all these types of suffering affect us at the same time? Explain how it could happen.

	•	Our Friends: Job 2:11-13, Then Job's three friends, Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite, heard about all the troubles that had come upon him, they set out from their homes and met together by agreement to go and sympathize with him and comfort him.				
	•	Our Church: 2 Corinthians 13:11, Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.				
		Question: Are your family, friends, church supportive and understanding when the days to trouble come. Or do you feel like you are on your own?				
		Question: What are some ways of developing relationships that will bless you and others, as you and they go through hard times?

• Rich Man and Lazarus: Luke 12:13-21

- This verse seems to imply that the rich man had memories and concerns for his earthly family, and he was in hell. So, his knowledge and relationships followed him.
- Abraham also seemed to have known about the rich man and Lazarus life, for he spoke about each other their earthly lives.
- The verse above are parables, so we must not read too much into them. The parable was written and attended to point and speak truth into certain situations.

• Queen of Sheba and Nineveh: Luke 11:29-32

The Martyrs: Revelation 6:9-11.

• The Angels in Heaven:

- Hebrews 1: 14, Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?

- 1 Peter 1: 12, It was revealed to them that they were not serving themselves but you, when they spoke of the things that have now been told you by those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven. Even angels long to look into these things.
- Luke 1 :26-28, God sent an Angel to Mary, the angel said, "Do not be afraid, he was concerned about her well-being".
- Daniel 10:4-21, (V12) Then he continued, "Do not be afraid, Daniel. Since the first day that you set your mind to gain understanding and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I have come in response to them.

- Matthew 11:28-30, Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you
 rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and
 you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."
- Luke 4:18-19, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

5. How do we find relief in suffering?

- Call on the Lord: Psalm 18:6, "In my distress I called upon the LORD, and cried to my God for help; He heard my voice out of His temple, And my cry for help before Him came into His ears."
- Call on the Elders: James 5: 13-16, Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned. they will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective
- Call out to your friends and Family: Matthew 25:34-40, "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' "Then the righteous will answer him, 'LORD, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'
- **Do not hide it your suffering:** It is foolishness to hide our affections, turn to the Lord and those around you. Grab ahold of all the means of Grace that God has given to you. He has set people in

your life that love Him and love you. They are looking for ways to exercise their faith and demonstrate their love. By keeping silent we rob ourselves and them from serving the Lord. In your sickness and weariness, God can you this to build up and refine people you and the people around you in their faith.
