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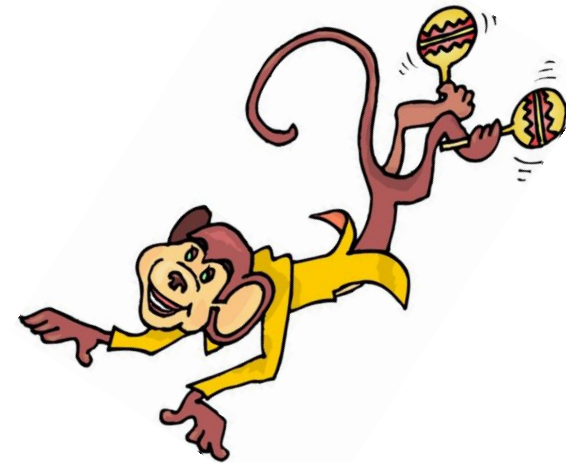

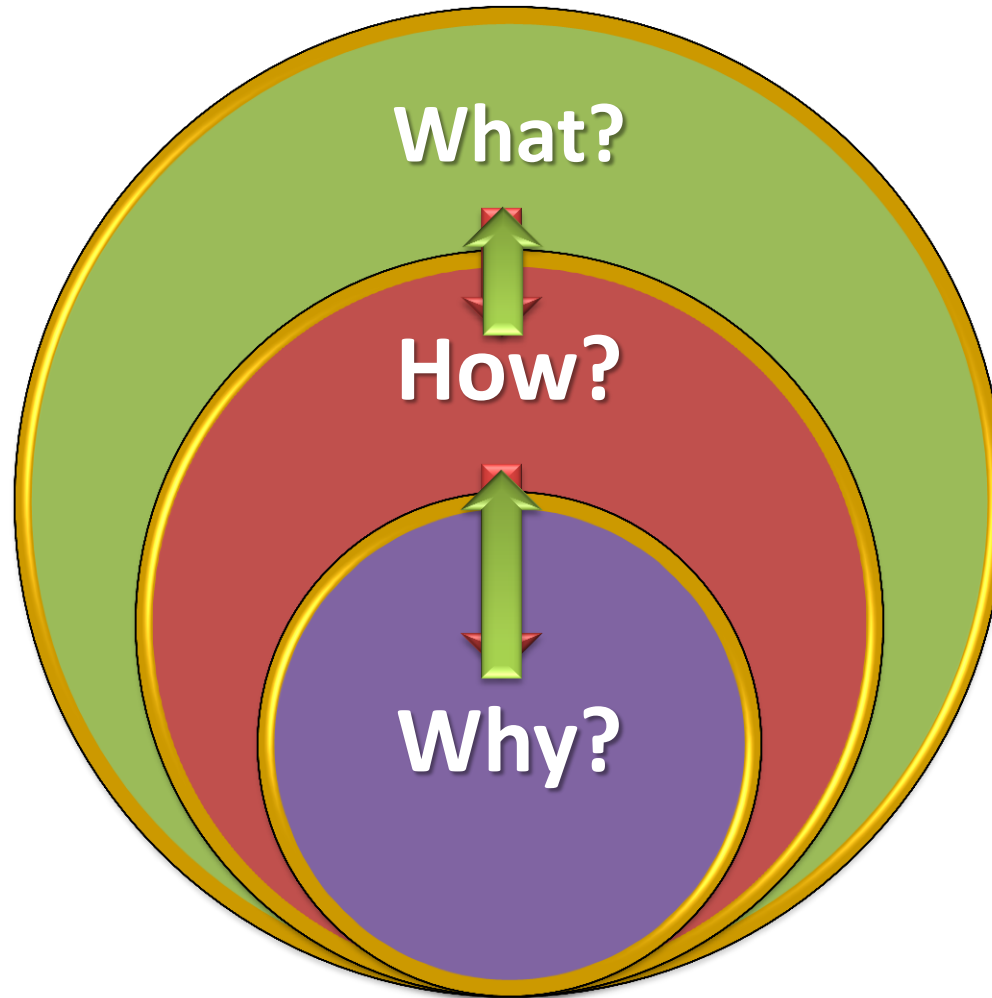

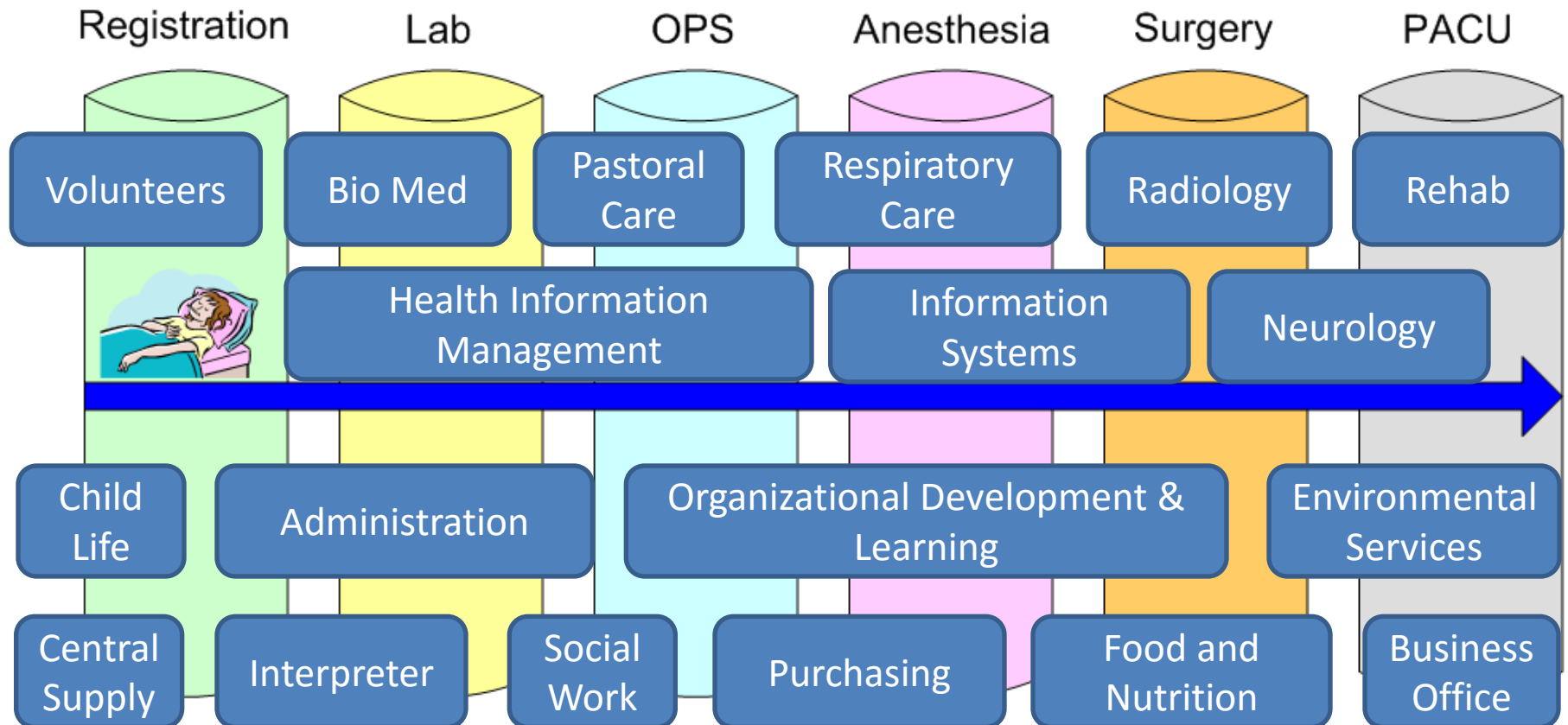

 - What does this look like today?
- Post-data:
 - Has the change worked?
 - Is there improvement?

How Do We Measure?

Data Collection Form Worksheet

What are the types of data you want to collect? What are the sources of the data and how will you gain access to it?

How will you collect your data?

Who will collect your data?

Why is this data being collected? How will you explain this to the data collectors?

How will you educate and train your data collectors? How will you ensure they understand how to use the form? How will you monitor that the data collection form is working?

What is the start date and stop date of the data collection?

How will you be able to sort and filter your data? How is this identified on the collection form?

Where do the completed forms go? How often will you collect the complete forms? Who will collect the completed forms?

What Can We Measure?

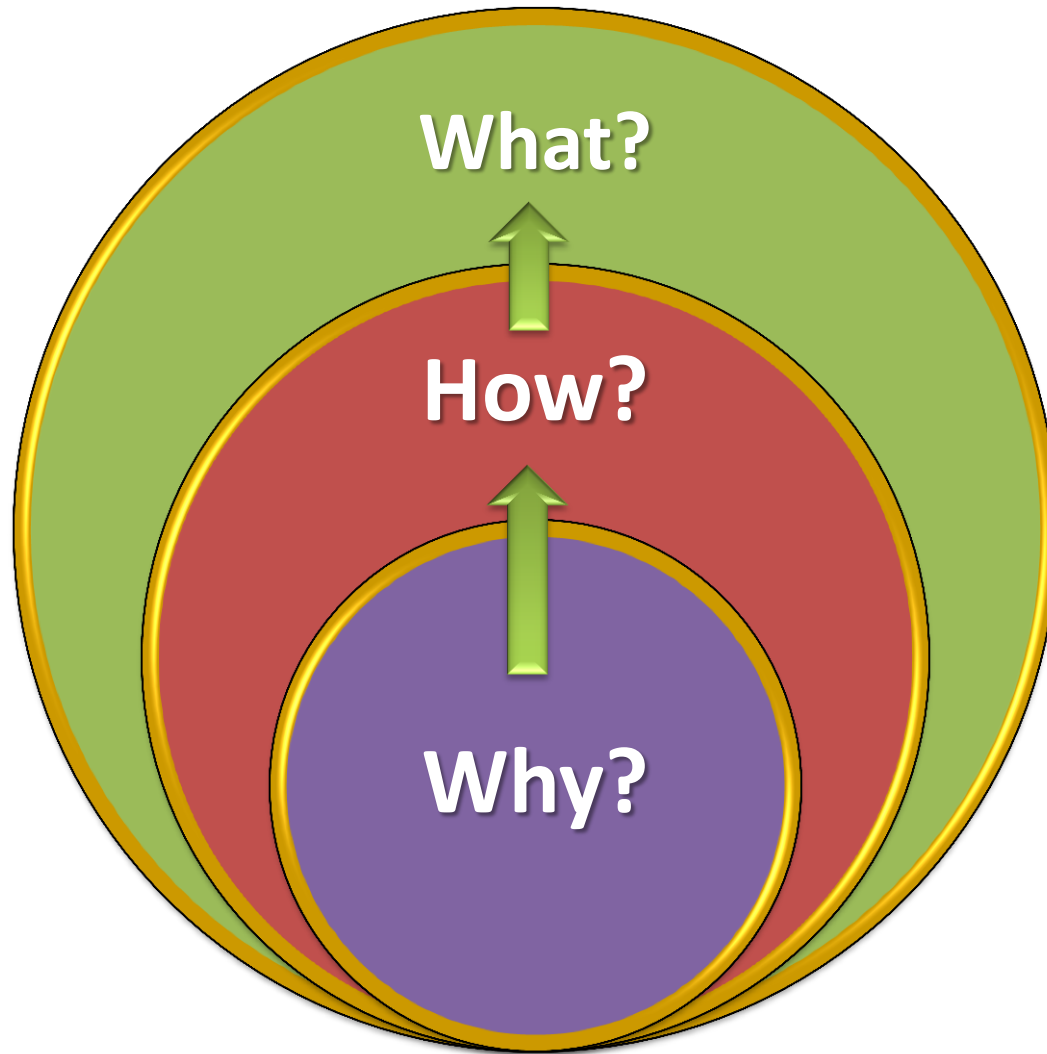
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- A. Inventory Levels** 1. *This happens 33 times a day.*
- B. Satisfaction** 7. *We have a 95% engagement rate.*
- C. Quality** 4. *It is accurate only 25% of the time.*
- D. Cost** 3. *It costs \$250.*
- E. Labor Hours** 2. *There are 3 FTEs dedicated to this task.*
- F. Occurrences** 6. *We have 100 cases and a 10 month supply level.*
- G. Time** 5. *It takes 3 hours from start to finish*



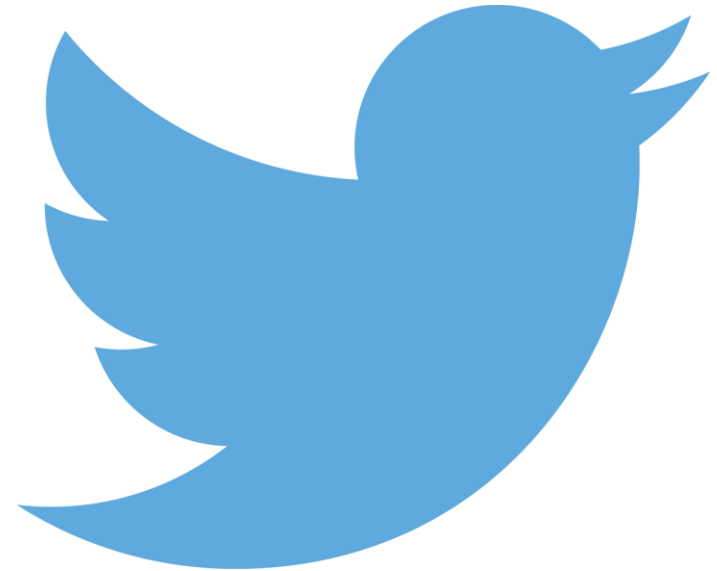
