Indication and clinical use

Beyfortus[†] (nirsevimab injection) is indicated for the prevention of Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) lower respiratory tract disease in:

- Neonates and infants during their first RSV season.
- Children up to 24 months of age who remain vulnerable to severe RSV disease through their second RSV season, which may include but is not limited to children with: chronic lung disease of prematurity (CLD), hemodynamically significant congenital heart disease (CHD), immunocompromised states, Down syndrome, cystic fibrosis, neuromuscular disease, and congenital airway anomalies.

Safety and efficacy in children older than 24 months of age have not been established. Safety and efficacy in infants with body weight below 1.6 kg have not been established. Dosing in infants with a body weight from 1.0 kg to <1.6 kg is based on extrapolation. The efficacy in infants who remain vulnerable to severe RSV disease during their first or second RSV season has not been directly established and is based on extrapolation of exposure only.

There is limited information available in extremely preterm infants (gestational age [GA] <29 weeks) less than 8 weeks of age, and no clinical data are available in infants with a postmenstrual age (gestational age at birth plus chronological age) of 32 weeks. Limited data are available in infants with Down syndrome (n=13), cystic fibrosis (n=5), congenital airway anomalies (n=9), and neuromuscular disease (n=0; not evaluated in clinical trials).

Not indicated for adults.

- Should be given with caution to individuals with thrombocytopenia, any coagulation disorder or to individuals on anticoagulation therapy.
- Serious hypersensitivity reactions, including anaphylaxis, have been observed rarely with other IgG1 monoclonal antibodies. Tailored Prevention for Older Adults: A Closer Look at RSV and Herpes Zoster

Description:

As many Canadians lack access to a primary care provider, nurses contribute greatly to addressing challenges in patient access through providing timely care as well as equipping patients with relevant information around disease prevention and immunization. Vaccination of aging adults faces unique challenges that have proven a barrier to increasing immunization awareness on preventable disease. Clinical discussion providing a deeper understanding of patients eligible for immunization, sharing of best practices and clinical tools to support patient counselling, as well as methods of improving communication along the patient pathway to ensure patients do not miss their opportunity to be protected are more relevant now than ever.

Learning Objectives:

1. Explain the role of age-related decline in immunity in aging adults' and increased risk of vaccine preventable diseases.
2. Discuss burden of disease and potential outcomes and complications of viral infections such as respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) and herpes zoster in the older adult population.
3. Summarize recent clinical data on the efficacy and safety of herpes zoster and RSV vaccination including duration of protection
4. Further discuss and develop the importance of nurses in furthering and leading discussions on vaccination and share practical skills to support patient counselling

The Future of RSV Prophylaxis in Infants and the Role of Nurses

Speaker: Erin Fleischer

Bio: Erin Fleischer is a Paediatric Nurse Practitioner at the Children's Hospital, London Health Sciences Centre. She completed her Bachelor of Science in Nursing with University of Victoria and went on to complete her Master of Nursing and Acute Care Nurse Practitioner certificate with the University of Toronto in 2009. Erin has been the Nurse Practitioner for the Paediatric Respiriology division since 2011 where she built and runs the centralized RSV prophylaxis clinic. Her other areas of clinical interest are, childhood asthma, for which she is a certified asthma educator, and paediatric cystic fibrosis. Erin is active in research and participated in the CARESS registry, a Canadian database which followed infants receiving RSV prophylaxis.
