Dog Grooming Tips



How Often Should My Dog Be Groomed?

Fluffy Cuts----- 4 to 6 Weeks

Short, Not Shaved-----7 to 9 Weeks

Shaved------10 Weeks or longer

Tips To Do At Home Between Grooming Visits

- 1) Brushing and Combing Your Dog's Hair Regularly Can Help Remove Dirt, Pest And Dead Hair. Dogs With Short, Smooth Coats Or Short Dense Coats Normally Need To Be Brushed 1 Weekly. Dogs With Longer Luxurious Coats Will Need To Be Brushed Daily.
- 2) Regular Teeth Brushing And Maintenance- Good Oral hygiene Just like In Humans Is Important, Because Dog Can't Verbally Tell Their

Owners If They Have a Toothache.Brushing Regularly Will Help
Prevent Build Up On Those Pearly Whites. This Also Lets You See If
There Is Any Decay. If There Is Your Pet Will Need To See A Vet Which
They Can Treat In There Office. You Can Use A Good Doggie
Toothpaste and A Long Doggy ToothBrush To Get Far in The Back To
Their Molars. Brush All The Surfaces Of The Teeth. Be Gentle On The
Start To Get Them Use To This Action. And Give Them A Treat
Afterwards To Reward Their Good Behavior.

3)Regular Ear Cleaning - This Is A Very Important Step To Also Do At Home. This Helps With Preventing Dog Ear Infections Along With Checking Them Periodically. Clean Your Dog's Ears Weekly With A Cleansing Solution And Gently Clean Around The Folds and Outside The Ear Canal. Avoid Using Q-Tips, Water Or A Syringe To Scrub The Ears.

You Can Easily Make a Cleaning Solution In A Old Bottle With Lid

2/3 Cups of Water

An 1/3 Cup Of Apple Cider Vinegar

If You Notice Any Smell Or Discharge This Is A Sign Of An Infection Which Can Be Treated with Some Drop From Your Vet.
