

WFPK Sunday Night Bluegrass Has a New Host

Aaron Bibelhauser on his role as DJ

Aaron Bibelhauser is now hosting WFPK's Sunday Night Bluegrass Show, hosted by recently retired DJ Berk Bryant for more than 25 years. Sonya Cotton visited with Aaron about this new gig for him.

Sonya: What got you interested in hosting the radio show?

Aaron: "Over the past decade and a half, I've accumulated quite a collection of vintage bluegrass music, vinyl and otherwise. I've also spent a great deal of time making music, and writing new bluegrass songs. While I didn't start with ambitions to become a radio personality, it has always been part of a bigger dream of mine to spread my love of the music around to as many folks as possible. Hosting and curating a three hour radio show, spinning my favorite bluegrass music is an awfully good way to do it! "

Sonya: What's been your biggest learning curve?

Aaron: "In the short term, there have been various technical aspects of producing Sunday Bluegrass that have caused a few bumps in the road, but the greatest learning experience has been conquering my previous aversion to public speaking. Since I began training with Michael Young at

WFPK, with his help, along with my desire to appropriately fill the enormous shoes of my predecessor, Berk Bryant, I've grown more and more comfortable behind the microphone."

Sonya: What goals do you have in mind for the show?

Aaron: "My primary objective hosting the show is just to spread positive bluegrass vibes! Like most of my musical endeavors, performing, recording, and writing, this means there's a balancing act between preserving tradition and nurturing the progress of new music that will push the genre forward."

Sonya: What else are you involved with now?"

Aaron: "With the support of my amazing wife, Cami, I've made a conscious effort to make all-things-music a priority. I spend a good portion of time gigging, with my brother Adam, and our local band, Relic. I have also done some touring and recording with the Wooks, and recently played on a new record with bluegrass legend, Roland White. In addition to that, I do a lot of session recording, both as a performer, and engineer for artists in the area and spend quite a bit of energy writing new bluegrass music and successfully getting songs cut by other touring musicians, including a new song that I co-wrote with Michael Cleveland on Del McCoury's latest record."
