

#### A Little "Bluegrass Shuffle" On the Local Airwaves

A small change to the lineup on Sunday afternoon/evenings on Louisville's public radio station "WFPK" happened in early August. "Roots N' Boots" with Michael Young will be happening a bit earlier in the day, from 3-6pm followed by "Bluegrass Evolution" (formerly Sunday Bluegrass) with Aaron Bibelhauser from 6-9pm pm, and wrapping the night up will be "Best of Bluegrass" with Bob Mitchell from 9-11pm. That's 8 hours of the best that Americana and Bluegrass music has to offer by three of the best radio hosts there are.

#### Some of the changes coming to BA include:

- Board members Robin Thixton (VP, Newsletter Editor), Paula Halfacre (Treasurer) and Sonya Cotton (Secretary) are retiring at year's end, Jan Nelson retired in June 2019. Personal responsibilities have made these changes necessary. BA is ready for new pickers and grinners to volunteer to help move BA to its next level.
- BA will become a donation-only organization with no memberships or dues, beginning in September 2019. If you paid your memberships in June 2019, or after, and want a refund, please contact B.A. by mail or email to discuss a refund.
- Pickin' Post #70, September 2019, will be the final hard-copy issue. Future newsletters may be published online.
- If there is no interest from others outside the current board to volunteer to continue BA as a non-profit bluegrass music organization, it will be dissolved. The decision will be made at the next quarterly board meeting, to be held in January 2020. At that time, if dissolution is chosen any funds in the BA budget will be donated to the Louisville Folk School, as decided at the board's June 2019 meeting.






