Growing Young

Have you ever wondered, "Where are all the kids we used to have in church?" Or "Why is our Sunday School so much smaller than a few decades ago?" Or "Where are the 20-somethings?" If so, you're not alone. In recent years, this trend has been seen in churches across the country, in every denomination. Yes, things have changed here at Prince of Peace. But it's not our fault. We haven't done something wrong. We haven't failed. But we also don't just need to sit here and accept it. There are things we can do. We can make Prince of Peace a place that is as **welcoming** and **inviting** and **loving** of young people as possible.

That is the message of a book published a few years ago called *Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church.* This book is the result of deep research and thoughtful prayer. It has provided many congregations with the tools to assess how they can make their church the most welcoming and loving congregation they can be.

It isn't a program to follow that solves everything. It isn't a silver bullet that brings all the kids running. Rather, it's a list of strategies and suggestions for ways we can subtly shift the *culture* of a congregation to be attractive and welcoming to young people.

The six strategies, or commitments, are these:

- Unlock keychain leadership.
- Empathize with today's young people.
- Take Jesus' message seriously.
- Fuel a warm community.
- Prioritize young people [and families] everywhere.
- Be the best neighbors.

I notice two things about those commitments. First, they're not just ways to make the church more welcoming for young people – the secret is they're also ways to make a better church all around. And second, they're things we're already doing, at least to some extent. What this book will help us to do is to do them more *intentionally*.

I will be reading the book *Growing Young* over the next eight months, and I invite you to join me. I want to make it as easy to participate as possible, so we're only going to meet once a month. I would like for you to be part of it. Could you commit to buying this book, reading one chapter a month, and meeting for an hour and a half each month? Our first meeting will be on **Saturday**, **August 2 at 9:00 am**. Watch for a sign-up sheet in the narthex with more information, and a place to order the book.

Together, we can help Prince of Peace "grow young"!



Grant-Funded Tech Project Sparks New Ministry Opportunities at Ziegels

In the fall of 2024, Ziegels Union Church, comprised of two sister congregations, the Ziegel United Church of Christ and Ziegels Lutheran Congregation, embarked on a joint effort to upgrade the shared 1908 church building's Fellowship Room with upgraded technology to enhance and increase informal worship and

educational mission opportunities. With potential applying grants to support the goal of ministries using technology, Mary Redline (UCC) and Winona Schappell (Lutheran) used local community and current congregation demographics piece one initiative with the application

of four grants: three from UCC Penn Conference grants, Energizing Ministries, Neighbors in Need, and Operational Love of Church, and one from the NEPA Synod Witness and Service grant. With creative planning, the grants were written to cover the funding of a \$13,000 technology initiative. By January 2025, we received notice from Penn Conference and NEPA Synod confirming that all four grant applications were accepted and approved. Excited about the opportunities that these grant approvals offered,

there were still more obstacles to address. The grants did not cover the full quote for a PC projection system from Lehigh Valley Sight and Sound, so fundraisers and memorial/donation drives were needed. However, Lehigh Valley Sight and Sound started work on the project, trusting that we would be successful in raising the balance.

The Lord's blessings came in many shapes and forms.

Communications started with the Union Treasurer on establishing an accounting system to monitor grant expenditures. Union committees

(Christian Education, Worship and Music, History, Fellowship) were contacted to

begin considering how to incorporate the use of the technology for our 275th Anniversary Celebrations in 2025. The Technology Committee helped to wire Internet connections, and the Property Committee found an electrician to complete the required electrical work. And with the Lord's blessings, individual members contributed donations and memorial funds of over \$6,300. With the support of the congregational members and committee volunteers, this whirlwind project was completed in three months.



On March 19th, Lehigh Valley Sight and Sound completed all the installations for a PC-controlled multimedia projection system. That same evening, Pastor Andy Meckstroth, Lutheran Pastor, used the projection system for the second Wednesday Lenten service held in the Fellowship Room. Both Pastor Andy and Pastor Larry Pickens, UCC Pastor, continued to use the projection system for the remaining Wednesday Lenten services.

Since March, several 275th Anniversary events have been held. Christian Education used the technology for a Martha Washington Tea Party and Youth Sunday worship service. The History Committee sponsored two presentations: The Pennsylvania Germans: Past, Present & Future by Dr. W. Donner and The Muhlenberg Family and the Lutheran Church in Early Pennsylvania by Christopher Malone, Curator of Historic church Weekly **PowerPoint** slideshows Trappe. announcements were presented during the Fellowship Hour that is held between the Lutheran and UCC Sunday services. Families have used the system to share family photos during viewings and funeral luncheons. The system is providing an avenue of endless ministry opportunities for church committees and leadership. Either/Or or Both?

"The Rich Young Man" asked Jesus, "Teacher, what good thing must I do to get eternal life?" People have been asking this question since the beginning of time. Jesus' answered, "Obey the commandments." Some, like "The Rich Young Man," feel confident they've fulfilled the commandments, but nagging doubts remain. They ask, along with the man, "What do I still lack?" (Matthew 19:16-26)

What is lacking is our ability to keep every law perfectly. Within the heart of every one of us lies our dread enemy: sin. We cannot do enough good things to defeat sin and gain eternal life. Paul tells us how we have been saved: "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith — and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Grace through faith saves us. Then is there any room for works in our lives? Paul addresses that question as well: "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10).

Why did Jesus ask the young man to give away his possessions? It was because those things so filled his heart there was no room for God's love. Therefore the good life he led and the good things he did were to no avail because they were not done for God and for his glory.

It's not "either/or"; it is "both." While we are saved by grace through faith alone and we rely solely on Christ and his redeeming work, our faith in evidenced through the works we do in his name and for his glory.

God Will Supply

We go to work based on the promise of a wage for our labor. We enter into marriage covenants promising to be faithful to our spouses for life. We get on planes, trusting the pilots are well trained and the aircraft safe so that we can get to our destinations. We drive our cars on the right side of the road (in the US, anyway!), confident that oncoming traffic will stay in their proper lanes.

If we put so much faith in fallible humans who are prone to error and misjudgment, how much more can we live as stewards who give first to God, trusting him to supply all our needs! "Praise be to the Lord," prayed Solomon. "Not one word has failed of all the good promises he gave through his servant Moses" (1 Kings 8:56).

God's stewards throughout history have praised God for his faithfulness: Elijah, fed by ravens beside the brook (1 Kings 17:2-4); Daniel in the lion's den (Daniel 6); Paul preaching the Word of God even while imprisoned (Acts 28:17-31).

How about the Macedonians who gave generously even out of their poverty to share with others they felt were even more needy (2 Corinthians 8)? All these attest to the faithfulness of God. Surely God has blessed us, too, so that we can bless others with our gifts. David, the psalmist, wrote from experience:

"I was young and now I am old, yet I have never seen the righteous forsaken or their children begging bread. They are always generous and lend freely; their children will be blessed" (Psalm 37:25-26).

A pig and a chicken were walking down a village street. They stopped outside a church to read a notice advertising a bazaar and tea, in support of the church's program. At the bottom of the sign they read: HAM AND EGGS WILL BE SERVED.

The chicken was heard to say, "See! Even we can help with the work of the church!"

"Yes," said the pig, "but yours is only a contribution. MINE IS A SACRIFICE."

Gratitude

Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-9) was a disliked tax collector who gathered money from his own Jewish people for the Roman government. Hearing that Jesus was coming, Zacchaeus had a strong desire to see this man everyone had been

talking about. Unfortunately, Zacchaeus, being short in stature, couldn't see over the crowds, but, also being resourceful, he climbed a tree for a perfect view.

When the Spirit of the Lord calls us, as he called Zacchaeus, we would do well to respond as Zacchaeus did. His hunger and thirst were great, and, sensing Jesus could satisfy it, he had no thoughts of pride or position. His focus was on Christ. Jesus said, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today" (Luke 19:5).

Zacchaeus was overwhelmed with gratitude, which showed in the words he spoke.

"Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount" (Luke 19:8).

Gratitude shows itself in thankful words and benevolent actions. As evidence of his gratitude Zacchaeus gave up what had, until that day, been all his joy ... his monetary wealth.

"Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost' ' (Luke 19:9-10).
