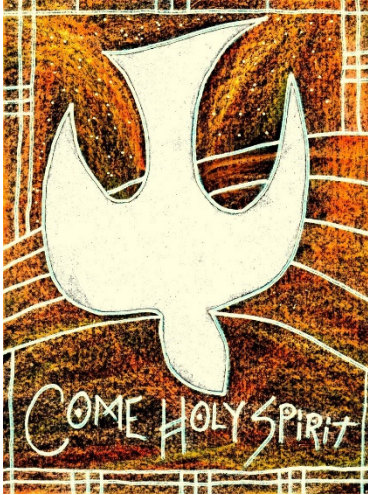


# Prints of Peace



This month I want to talk a little bit about spirituality and Pentecost. First off, what is *spirituality*? It's a difficult thing to define. Some people say, "I'm spiritual but not religious." I think what they're saying is that they believe in God (in some form or another), but don't participate in any formal religious rituals or gatherings. So, spirituality has something to do with believing in God. We might think of spirituality as the part of us that yearns for something deeper, something *more* than everyday life. The part of us that reaches out for connection and meaning in life. The part of us where God connects with us.

We might think of spirituality as one aspect of who we are. We are a *body*, a *mind*, and a *spirit*. As a body, we move and interact with the world. As a mind, we think, figure things out, and ponder. And as a spirit, we yearn and connect with God. The movement, the stirring, of our spirit is spirituality.

Or we might think of spirituality as an *action*, as whatever activity or undertaking brings us closer to God or brings us closer to our understanding of God. That might include things like prayer, scripture reading, worship, acts of kindness, generosity, meditation, and more.

However, you think about it, spirituality is connected to our *relationship with God and with God's people*. I've made it a goal for this year to offer new opportunities for you to explore spirituality at Prince of Peace. That's why we focused on the Psalms throughout Lent. That's also why we had three extra services during Holy Week, which were very spiritually centered. I have some other ideas for activities coming up later this year, so stay tuned!

And in May there is a church holiday that is very spiritual – in fact, it's centered on the *Holy Spirit*. This holiday is the **Day of Pentecost**, which is always fifty days after Easter Day. This unique day celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit into the lives of the first disciples and coming anew into our lives today. Pentecost is fifty days after the Resurrection for at least two reasons: for one thing, fifty is seven times seven (plus one). That means it's a "week of weeks." This is a very holy and special number in biblical understanding – seven symbolizes perfection, so seven times seven is total perfection! Also, the book of Acts tells us that it was fifty days after the resurrection when the Holy Spirit came to the disciples in a miraculous way – alighting on them like tongues of fire, giving them the ability to proclaim God's good news to people who spoke many different languages!

Pentecost is a day to celebrate the way the Holy Spirit acts in our lives. Martin Luther outlined five things the Holy Spirit does for us: the Spirit *calls us*, *gathers us together*, *enlightens us*, *makes us holy*, and *keeps us in the faith*. The Spirit is indeed doing all those things through the people of Prince of Peace! Come and celebrate that day. And explore your spirituality throughout the year – God loves you and wants a deep relationship with you. Your spirit yearns for that.

**Sunday Coffee Hour in Fellowship Hall**

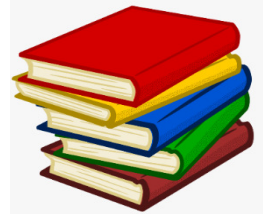

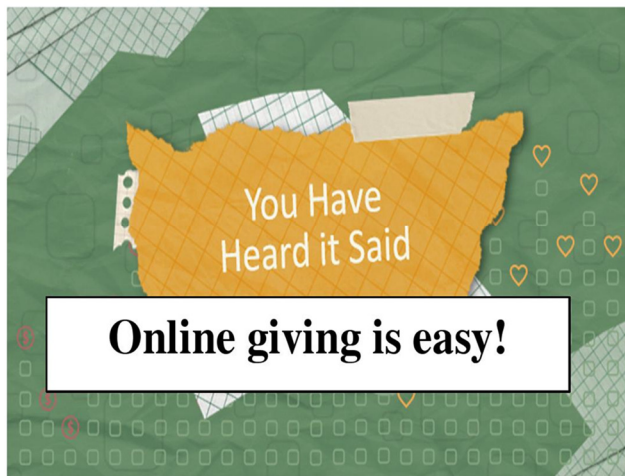

On Saturday September 23, Growing Young of Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod partnered with St John's Lutheran in Nazareth with an event called SowSession: Empathy Today.

Jen Bradbury from Fuller Youth Institute facilitated the workshop providing examples and guidance on how to help answer questions of Gen Z youth through grace, love and mission. Youth need to see we are here to journey *with* them. We should not approach situations thinking we are here to fix anything, but rather to listen and show empathy. Youth need individuals they can trust and feel safe around. They need individuals to remind them they are enough because of Jesus, and that they belong with God's people. And most importantly they are invited into God's greater story. Participants of the Sow Session left with a wealth of knowledge on how to begin showing more empathy towards youth today. The Growing Young concept helps congregations retain and attract youth, young adults and families into a Jesus-centered community and it is a way to revitalize your congregation's ministry. What would it look like to show more empathy towards people we do not know or understand or who may think differently than we do? Jesus was and is always there to journey *with* us no matter what or where we are in life. Showing youth, we are there to journey *with* them is one way you can begin Growing Young too. The tuition assistance made a real difference in helping to alleviate some of those worries and allowed Lisa Dubay and now the Reverend Jennifer Toburen to follow a call into ministry without the financial fears causing anxiety. How do you go from two full time careers, having a home in Michigan, family that is still there, and then uproot everything you know? It's difficult, but when the Holy Spirit calls, you might be slow about following, but you still follow. Because synods and congregations like you have been **supporting** the seminary in such an important way, you helped ensure that we did not incur deep financial debt as we followed this call into ministry. The easing of this financial burden allowed us to relocate to Pennsylvania, find new jobs, and immerse ourselves in the new journey more easily.

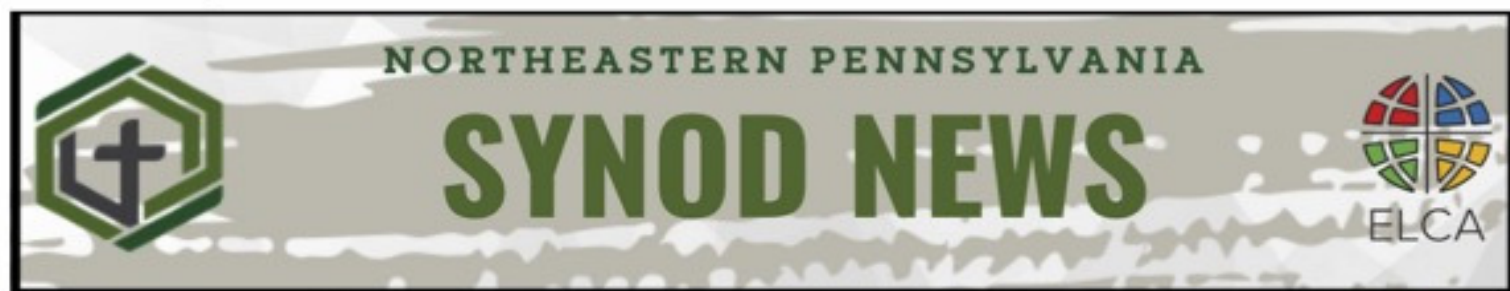

Ministry

A story from the Central States  
Synod

As you read this story, what connects with you?  
What experiments are occurring in your synod  
and congregation?

How often have you heard folks in congregations lament that they just don't have the resources or learning opportunities they need to be strong leaders and vital congregations? The [Central States Synod](#) wondered how it could help address those needs and make access easy. That led to the beginning of the [Ministry Lab](#). The synod envisions the lab as a place to ask questions, learn, work with different "tools" or resources, and experiment to see what works. A lab is not just a depository for resources; it's an active place where one can gather and engage with others.

When visiting congregations, attending conferences or meeting partners, staff and leaders in the Central States Synod diligently listen to folks to identify common needs and areas of growth so that they can equip and support ministry. The goal of the Ministry Lab is to provide *"resources and tools so that we may live out God's purpose, united with Christ, as we walk the way of Jesus."*



The lab has three areas of focus: *good order*, meaning leadership, policies, building use, stewardship and meeting protocol; *means of grace*, including biblical interpretation, worship, communication and welcoming; and *living faith*, such as community engagement, social statements, collaboration and technology. Since the Ministry Lab began in fall 2023, it has offered opportunities focused on Scripture interpretation, ideas for worship and preaching during Advent, and leadership development. People learn through active engagement, not passive observation, so the Learning Lab is always lively. Some opportunities are "one and done" whereas others consist of multiple sessions.

Moving forward, the Ministry Lab is excited to offer an open conversation with the Rev. Susan Candea, bishop of the Central States Synod, about the upcoming ELCA social statement *Civic Life and Faith*, a Collaboration Lab in May and a Communications Lab in the fall. Anyone anywhere can check out and learn from the Central States Synod Ministry Lab. [See what's available now!](#)

Remember that a portion of offerings given to Central States congregations becomes Mission Support for the synod and allows staff and leaders to address congregations' needs and interests through the Ministry Lab, today and into the future.
