Prints of Peace





The Church Year has been developed over the course of many centuries. Designed and discerned by people who lived in the northern hemisphere, it ties in with the seasonal changes that happen around us. We celebrate the Incarnation (the coming of God in human form) in December not because we know that Jesus was born in December. In fact, scholars have absolutely no idea what time of year was born, and the gospels give no evidence whatsoever. We celebrate Christ's birth in December

because that is the darkest time of year, the time when we yearn for the Light to shine in the darkness, and we are reminded that the Light *has come* into our darkness. We celebrate Easter at the dawn of spring partially because this connects it to the Jewish festival of Passover, when Jesus was crucified. But just as importantly, spring is the time when life returns to a world that seemed dead. As buds begin to appear and the first flowers bloom, we celebrate the new Life that Christ brings to us even when we feel dead.

So, we are now in the time of the church year known as *The Time after Epiphany*, or *Ordinary Time*. (The word *ordinary* here does not mean "commonplace," but rather "ordered," because the readings we hear each week follow a specific order.) This is a time focused on spiritual growth; we might imagine being cooped up in a cold house in the winter, sitting before a fireplace with a cup of coffee reading and praying and studying. This season began on January 6 with the Epiphany, a time when the light of Christ shone so brightly that magi from the east saw it, and came to pay him homage. The season will end on February 27 with the Transfiguration, a time when Christ again shone so brightly that the disciples were overwhelmed, and a vision of Moses and Elijah appeared. In the meantime, we learn and grow as enlightenment grows within us.

Join us for worship during the Time after Epiphany. On February 6, stand at the shore and watch as Jesus shows Simon Peter how his vocation of fisherman can be used for the Kingdom of God. On February 13, sit in the plain as Jesus tells us about what it means to be blessed in our life. On February 20, listen to Jesus as he explores the miraculous way that faith can do what seems impossible, transforming us into people who can love our enemies and be merciful to the ungrateful. On February 27, stand in awe as Jesus himself is transformed into a beam of light, shining from the mountaintop.

Join us, whether in person or online. Grow in your faith and understanding. Live the way Christ calls us to live. Worship the Lord of heaven and earth.





Arndt's Lutheran Church in Easton





Hunger is a real problem in our country and our area of Pennsylvania is no different. Last year we started a reverse Advent food drive where congregants collected food items each day during Advent, culminating with delivery to our local food bank. It was such a success that we decided to expand it to the community. Volunteers will collect, sort, and deliver food items to the pantry right after Christmas when the need is the greatest. This year's food drive was very successful as we collected 983 lbs. of food valued at \$1671 for the ProJeCt Easton Food Pantry in Easton, PA. Approximately 43 families from Arndt's and people outside the community participated in the project. A local moving company donated a truck and manpower for the delivery. We hope to make this project an annual event of providing for those in need.
