## Prints of Peace



May you have an Anticipatory Advent, and a Merry Christmas!

"Anticipatory"? That's a 50-cent word. What do I mean by that? Well, Martin and I have been working with the Worship and Music Committee to develop a very special Advent this year. It all started when we noticed that Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year. We thought, "How can we best have worship in the morning, and then Christmas Eve worship in the afternoon and evening?" Through conversations, debates, and connection with a new program called "Advent in a Box," we have stumbled upon what we think will be four very special weeks of Advent, four weeks in which we focus on *Anticipation*.

Traditionally, Advent is all about *waiting*. While the outside world is so busy, busy in December with gift-shopping and parties, baking and decorating, the church has offered a reminder that we must learn to *wait*. This year, that waiting focus is still there, but it's a particular kind of waiting: *Anticipation*. Anticipation isn't a slow, impatient, boring kind of waiting – anticipation is an excited, expectant, bouncy, happy kind of waiting. Anticipation is the kind of waiting that kids do on December 24, so excited about what's about to happen. And even while we know what it's like to wait for Christ to come into our lives, we can wait with *Anticipation*, excited and joyful that he's right around the bend, and in fact, is already here!

In our Advent worship, we will attempt to capture this feeling of *Anticipation*. Here's what you can expect when you attend worship on Sunday mornings, December 3, 10, 17, and 24:

- We will decorate together! *As part of worship*, we will do some of the decorating for Christmas. This way, we will prepare for Christ's coming together.
- We will focus on the First Readings from Isaiah each week, the prophet who called the people to get ready, and to wait expectantly for the Messiah.
- We will celebrate Holy Communion, the very presence of Christ today, and we will use the "Christmas Carol Thanksgiving" we've used for the past few years.
- We will sing some Advent songs and some Christmas songs, a blend that we hope will allow us to experience both the *yearning* for Christ's coming and the *joy* that Christ is already among us.

Join us for Advent worship: 9:45 am on Sundays, December 3, 10, 17 and 24.

Join us for **Blue Christmas worship: 3:00 pm on Sunday, December 17.** This special service is designed especially for people who find the holidays difficult, for whatever reason. All are welcome, and there will be a time for refreshments and fellowship to follow.

Join us for Christmas Eve worship: 3:30 pm and 6:30 pm on Sunday, December 24. Special preludes start at 3:00 and 6:00, so make sure to come early!

Lutheran World Relief will distribute our gifts around the world to newborns and families in need. You can help by donating items for the layettes, giving a monetary gift to help purchase items, and/or share your time to prepare the layettes at the baby shower. Sizes 6 to 24 months may be used. If you want to make sweaters or diapers, go to <a href="https://www.lwr.org/beinvolved">www.lwr.org/beinvolved</a> and click on Baby Care Kits for patterns. They specify that we are not permitted to add other items to the kits.

#### Kits will include:

lightweight cotton t-shirts, long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers without feet (top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers pajama top/pant sets may be substituted), receiving blankets up to 52" square, cloth diapers, flat fold preferred, jacket, sweaters or sweatshirt with a hood or baby cap, socks, hand towel, dark color recommended, bath-size bars of gentle soap in the wrapping (like Ivory or Dove), diaper pins or large safety pins.



# Young Adult in Global Mission: A Year in Senegal Asalaa maalekum. May God's peace be upon you.

My name is Quentin Bernhard. I recently served with the ELCA program Young Adults in Global Mission—YAGM—in Senegal. My time with YAGM came to an end in July, and Senegal country cohort peers and I returned to the United States. We are among the 23 young adults from the 2022-2023 year who served in accompaniment in four different country programs.

I live in New Tripoli in Lehigh County, and I'm a member of New Life Lutheran Church in New Tripoli. Many individuals and congregations from our synod supported me in my YAGM year. Thank you for your support of my time in Senegal and for the opportunity to be in continuing relationship after my time abroad.

My coming to the United States, to the communities I grew up in in Pennsylvania, was also my leaving a community I grew in—a community I grew in as a Lutheran and as a young person, one I have good friends in. I lived in Yeumbeul Bene Baraque, in western Senegal, for ten months. I lived with a host family in a community. I saw friends every day, many when at my placement site. Connected with our partner organization Senegalese Lutheran Development Services—SLDS—I worked in a community center that serves the community in numerous ways, splitting my time between the library and the mutual fund credit union.

My friends and family in Senegal continue to send me voice messages, reminding me that I am also Maguette Ndiaye, my Senegalese name, and reminding me that we are still connected, even if connected in a different way now. Our relationships and our future—all of our future—is unknown to us. Our faith—and our trust in one another—can allow us to take steps and leaps in that future.
