

# Prints of Peace

**“What are we going to do about Pastoral Care, now that our Pastoral Assistant has retired?”**



This has been a question asked many times over the past few months, by many people, myself included. Pastoral Assistant Larry Rissmiller gave us a great gift for many years, serving as a part-time pastoral assistant without pay. Larry and I coordinated to try to ensure that members in acute pastoral need (such as a hospital stay) received regular visits, and we worked with the lay Eucharist visitors to provide regular pastoral care for our homebound members. In addition to this, Larry provided pastoral conversation (counseling) for many people who requested it. Larry and I have very different life experiences, so it is natural that some people felt more comfortable talking to me, while others felt more comfortable with him. I am grateful for the partnership we shared for my first seven years at Prince of Peace. I have estimated that Larry and I split the professional pastoral care of the congregation about 70% (me) – 30% (Larry). That is a huge vacuum to fill.

Many conversations have occurred in various committees (e.g. Mutual Ministry, Health & Wellness, and Congregation Council) about what to do now. Some ideas have been batted around – lifting up and training a lay person to do some of the tasks Larry performed; or trying find a way to afford to pay someone to do this work; or accepting that we will be receiving pastoral care at a lesser level than we have grown accustomed to. We’ve not been able to come to a consensus at this point, in part because we’re all trying to identify just what *pastoral care* means.

Notice above when I said that Larry and I split the care 70%-30%, I described it as *professional pastoral care*. Between the two of us, we accounted for 100% of the *professional* pastoral care here, but by no means did we provide 100% of the *pastoral care*. Because pastoral care is so much broader, so much wider, so much more than what pastors and pastoral assistants do. There is an awful lot of pastoral care done by people like our Lay Eucharist visitors, our Telecare ministry, Mending Meals, our prayer chain, and many, many other things that *you* have been doing.

So here’s what we’re going to do. Congregation Council and I have decided to lead the congregation in a two-month period of **prayer** about what we can and will do to provide Pastoral Care into the future. This two-month period started on Sunday, December 15, and will continue into February. Each week will have a theme focusing on a different element of pastoral care. We will pray about it in worship, and I will provide prayer resources for you to use alone or in small groups throughout the week. I also encourage you to pick up a very short and inexpensive book, *Caring for One Another* by Edward T. Welch. (Available at Amazon for \$7.89 for paperback, \$7.50 for Kindle.) To any small groups who plan to keep meeting in the new year, I commend this book to you as a resource.

At the end of the two months, we will offer a time for congregational discussion, to begin to decide what to do regarding pastoral care at Prince of Peace, both *professional pastoral care* and more broadly, care in general. I truly believe that praying *first*, before we have this meeting, will enable us together to make the decisions God is calling us to. Feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.


These wise men observed and studied natural phenomena, asking, “What does this mean?” They paid close attention to the world around them. We are wise when we do the same.

## Stewardship of time

*O God, teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart. -Psalm 90:12*  
What does it mean to count our days? Certainly, the poet who wrote Psalm 90:12 was thinking of more than arithmetic, which may not necessarily gain us a wise heart. Wisdom comes from perspective, from painful introspection and prayerful deliberation.

We count in order to know not only how many days we have *lived*, but to ponder how many days we might have *left*. Counting, we remember that we are finite creatures whose lives march forward in steady 24-hour steps, carrying us from birth to death. Knowing, then, that our days are numbered, we appreciate each one more fully.

We count our days to gain the wisdom that every day is sacred; every day presents opportunities to live more fully in relationship with God and our neighbors; every day is for love and joy and peace and fulfillment. Yet it's all too easy to let the days slip away.

This month consider a focus on stewardship of your time – how you spend every day God gives you. Here is a “to do” list for making the most of every day:

**Pray:** Begin each day communicating with the creator of the universe, meditating on Scripture or a wise Christian author. Even 10 minutes. End by praying Psalm 118:24: “This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.”

**Care:** Convey through word or deed how much you care about someone in your life. Call up an old friend or relative. Invite a co-worker to lunch.

**Help:** Look for some way to assist someone. Volunteer. Hold a door open for someone entering a store behind you. Stop for a pedestrian who wants to cross the street.

**Enrich:** Find something that will deepen your knowledge, understanding or appreciation of the world. Read a poem or book. Listen to a sermon podcast or educational news program.

**Stop.** That's right, do nothing. For at least 10 minutes (use your smart phone timer) sit quietly, breathe deeply and try to clear the busy thoughts from your mind. Open your spirit to God's presence.

**Be healthy:** Do something to increase your physical health, such as eating a nutritious meal or taking a walk.

**Pray:** End every day thanking the creator of the universe for another wonderful day. A day you have counted and that you have made count.

Focus on stewardship of time and see how your own life will change. Make it a permanent part of your discipleship.
